County PTA Council Backs City Water Fluoridation

In September 1952, the National Congress of Parents and Teachers voted to recommend the fluoridation of all central water supplies, in the United States, that are below normal in fluoride content. Before they took this action, an extensive research was completed of every possible fact concerning fluoridated water, that proved all effects are beneficial where the water supply contains fluoride in concentrations as high and even higher than that recommended.

The arguments that fluoride will cause an increase in kidney disease, in fractures, or in the rapidly of cancer growth has been disproved in the many areas in the United States where the water supply has a fluoride content three to five times higher than the recommended amount. Physicians, dentists, chemists, and water supply engineers have proven that a person would have to drink 300 gallons of water in one day to suffer even minor ill.

Children who drink fluoride-bearing water from birth receive the greatest benefit, because most enamel of the teeth forms during the first eight years of life. Older individuals who begin drinking water containing the desirable amount of fluoride receive some protection against dental decay but not as much as children.

Many areas are luckier than Klamath Falls for nature has already supplied them with a beneficial amount of fluoride in their drinking water. All users of Klamath Falls water that favor fluoridation must notify the Water Co. of their approval of Klamath Falls will not get the necessary fluorides for its water supply.

The Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers and Klamath PTA units recommend fluoridation of the water supply. These associations would not recommend such action if there were the slightest possibility of any ill effects from fluoridated water.

Ancient Rib Roast Feast

ALBUQUERQUE (AP)—Indications of how prehistoric humans carved a caveman's rib roast from a slain mammoth have been found on a ranch near Estancia, N. M.

Officials at the University of New Mexico say a skeleton turned up by a plow proved to be that of a huge beast slain by Folsom hunters some 10,000 years ago. It bore indications that a 300-pound rib roast had been hacked out by some flint instrument.

Folsom man is a prehistoric human believed to have lived in this area about 10,000 B. C. Mammoths, among the big game hunted by Folsom man, sometimes weighed as much as 11 tons.
