

Jack Franey, Mel Henry Trophies Set by Posse

Two perpetual trophies, memorials to former members of the Klamath County Sheriff's Posse, have been put into circulation among the groups affiliated with the Oregon Association of Mounted Poses.

The Jack Franey Memorial Trophy is to go each year to the county posse organization having the largest attendance at the association's convention. It was awarded to the Linn County Sheriff's Posse Saturday night during the windup of the association's convention here.

That trophy was put up in honor to the late Sheriff Jack Franey of Klamath County.

The other new award, the Mel

Henry Memorial Trophy, is to go each year to the group in the association most actively participating in community efforts. It went first to the Benton County Sheriff's Posse.

Still another trophy, one established by the association and going to the riding group garnering the most honors on a point basis in recognized show competition in the state, went to the Linn County group, and six members of the Linn riding team won silver belt buckles.

Next year's convention of the posse association will be held at McMinnville, and the summer's overnight ride, Aug. 14-15-16, will be to Tillamook.

Lee Pruitt of Grants Pass was elected new president of the association, succeeding Matt Vetsch of Portland. Art Herrold of Linn County was chosen first vice president; Ralph Dunlavy, Klamath Falls, second vice president; John Hart, McMinnville, third vice president; Dennis Hahn, Grants Pass, secretary-treasurer; and Doyle Pearson of Clackamas County, publicity director.

The convention, first of this year for Klamath Falls, attracted horse-

men from all over the state and the banquet room of the Willard Hotel wasn't big enough to handle the crowd at the dinner and entertainment, Saturday night.

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Arrangements for the convention were handled largely by Ralph Dunlavy of the Klamath County Sheriff's Posse, Sheriff Red Britton and others. A. W. (Dusty) Rhodes of Clackamas County, immediate past president of the association, acted as master of ceremonies for the program.

The entertainment, part profes-

sional and part amateur, included numbers by Ward Hillerich, Nadine Jansen (beginning an engagement at the Ponderosa Room), an Oregon Tech duet composed of football players Larry Jeter and

Greene Rudd, Art Robison, students of the Normadean Dance Studio and others.

The business session of the convention concerned itself with numerous suggestions for rules changes

for show riding, as adopted.

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Generous Americans Rally To Aid of Flood Victims

NEW YORK (AP)—An epic of human compassion and suffering is being written now in communities across America and on the flood-torn shores of Holland.

It is a spontaneous movement among hundreds of thousands of Americans to help hundreds of thousands of Hollanders in the wake of catastrophe.

At Camp Drum, N. Y., paratroopers of the 82nd Airborne Division conducted a two-day collection drive, raised \$12,240 and sent a delegation with it to The Netherlands consulate general in New York.

"When we jumped into Holland during World War II, and the Germans were all over the place, your farmers risked their lives to hide us and feed us," they said in effect in presenting the check, "we remember."

GOOD-CHILD

In Kansas City a little girl walked slowly home from school. Throughout her suppertime, emotions chased across her face. Finally, she laid down her spoon and went upstairs.

"I was saving for a bicycle," she wrote. "But I would rather the children in Holland had this five dollars."

In a New England village an old man living on a small pension, walked to the postoffice in the rain to mail a \$10 check.

"You Dutch renounced your Marshall Plan aid not long ago," said his letter. "I like the way you stand on your own feet. I wish I had more to help you."

In a living room in Huntington Valley, Pa., a baby sitter, alone before a television set heard of Holland's plight. "Here is the money I earned tonight," she said in the letter with the check she sent to the consulate.

In New York, Clarence Michalis, bank president and head of Dutch war relief during World War II, organized Holland Flood Relief and got it into action with a national committee including John J. McCloy, former U. S. High Commissioner in Germany, and Herman

Baruch, former American ambassador to The Netherlands.

FUNDS FLOOD

Volunteers came from the Dutch United Nations delegation to handle the mail that poured into the organization's wall street headquarters. The first day's contributions totalled more than \$30,000, chiefly in large sums.

From manufacturers come gifts of medicine, medical equipment and outdoor motors to help in flood rescue and salvage work. There's an offer of 100 cows, another of 1,000 steaks. Some have to be turned down because of transportation difficulties.

Day and night—from the big and little, the rich and poor, the flood of compassion pours on.

"I have never seen anything like this before," said a Dutch consulate official, striving to keep his voice level. "You feel it in your throat."

Nightclub Burns

MEDFORD (AP)—Fire destroyed the Red Barn, a night club on the south edge of Medford, early Saturday.

The origin of the flames, and the amount of loss were not determined at once. The club had been closed recently for remodeling.

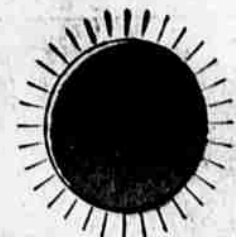
Ray Jinds and C. O. Bellis, Medford, owners, said some insurance was carried.

Fire Chief Gordon Baker, Medford, said the entire building was in flames when the rural fire truck arrived at 5:45 a.m.

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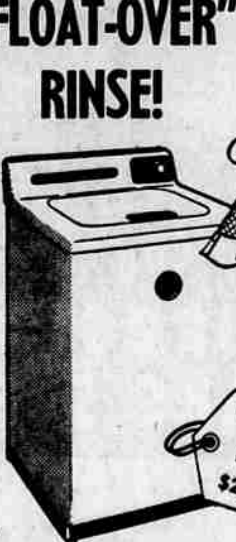
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
