Price Control Info Needed

The Seattle regional office of Price Stabilization cautions all merchants in the area against premature disposal of business records required by the price control program. Whatever records were required to be kept must be preserved for certain periods of time, E. R. Thissen, acting regional director, stated.

However, once a price control regulation has been revoked, no records of future transactions are necessary, Thissen noted.

Different regulations set up different periods of time for which records must be kept. The maximum period is two years after the expiration of the Defense Production Act which is scheduled to expire April 30.

Neither the decontrol of a commodity or service, nor the end of the Defense Production Act, bars enforcement action for a violation which took place while OPS regulations were in effect, Thissen added.

S. P. Switchmen Suffer Injuries

DUNSMUIR — Three Southern Pacific railway switchmen were injured in the lower yard here Saturday night when they were jolted from the rear of a caboose.

Ray Slingsby, most seriously injured, suffered a fractured pelvis and severe groin injury. Ray Wiseman suffered injuries to an eye, a hip and his ribs. Both are in Mount Shasta Hospital. The third man, Leo Penman, had a concussion and rib injury but was released from the hospital and sent home.
