

Time Gambler Faces Deportation to Italy

N. J. (AP)—Big-time gambler, already sentenced to New Jersey State Prison for a year, faces deportation to Italy. The man, whose real name is Joseph Adonis, was spotlighted in 1951 by the Crime Investigating Commission as one of the American crime. Although arrested on charges from 1936 to 1948, he never served a day in prison.

Crash Sought

CITY (AP)—Federal and state investigators are seeking a crash failure and caused the disastrous crash here Saturday in which at least 30 were killed and 22 others injured.

The antiquated cars, with 90 pickpockets, were on a steep grade and caused a trolley laborer to fall. A car's motorist, who was amputated, said a "dry crack" when he saw the car at the top of the hill. They failed to take control, and the car rolled down the curving grade.

Texans Feud, Four Killed

RAYMONDVILLE, Tex. (AP)—The Cavazos and Trevino brothers shot it out in a tavern yesterday, killing four members of the two feuding families. Officers weren't able to find the exact cause that sparked the fight that killed George Cavazos, 23; Urbano Cavazos, 41; Lorenzo Trevino, 31; and Manuel Trevino, 30.

Farm Bureau Chief Named

SALEM (AP)—Ben Robinson, Union County farmer, will take over presidency of the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation. The board of directors, at a special meeting to consider a successor to Marshall Swearingen who resigned to devote full time to his farm near Bend and other farming activities, elected Robinson from the vice presidency. The action was made public Saturday.

With Killed Gun Game

BERSON, Kan. (AP)—A 17-year-old boy was shot to death while he and three other boys were playing a game with a .38-caliber pistol. Sheriff Lyle Dickinson said the boys were trying to see how close they could shoot at each other. The boy's aim was poor and he was killed by a bullet in the head, the officer said. The other three boys were unhurt.

Israel Rid Of Soviets

Renewal Delayed on Tax Probers 'Police Power'

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More Oil for More People

Civilian and defense demands for gasoline in the West have become so great that California in 1952 was forced to import more than 28,000,000 barrels of oil. This oil was brought from as far away as the East Indies, Venezuela, and the Texas Gulf Coast to keep our automobiles and trucks running and our defense effort rolling. Current price increases are needed to cover the increased cost of the long-haul oil needed to fill the deficit in the California supply. They are also needed to quickly stimulate greater production in California. Historically, most new oil reserves have been discovered by independent oil drillers working for themselves, not by large oil companies.

Under the present price structure that has existed during the last two years, increasing costs have seriously curtailed the activities of these independents until the supply of oil has fallen behind demand.

Why This Heavy Demand?

Population in the five western states in the last ten years has increased 50% and is continuing its rapid rate of increase. Motor vehicle registration — automobiles and trucks — increased 62% in the same ten-year period. Gasoline used in the five western states during the same ten years increased 98%.

But the Real Answer is Better Use of Our Reserves

Maximum use of our reserves can be obtained only under sound laws. California is the only important oil-producing state in the country without an adequate oil-conservation law. Because California has not had proper oil-conservation laws governing the recovery of oil from our known reserves, there has been left in the ground — lost for all time — enough daily production of oil to have equalled the millions of barrels of oil we now must import.

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
