 Superior Judge George A. Dockweiler went to the bedside of Mrs. Eleanor Bonus, 53, yesterday for a five-minute hearing. Then he granted the uncontested interlocutory decree from Fred Bonus, 54.
 She wanted the divorce to legalize a property settlement under which the family home would go to the children and Bonus would be required to pay \$30 monthly support for the only minor child, Barbara, 18.
 Mrs. Bonus' attorney told the judge his client suffers from leukemia and has perhaps only weeks to live.
