

...n Gives Amendment To Congress

OTON-In an address of the House of Representatives Monday, Rep. Sam Con 2nd District) asked amendment to the United

States constitution to prevent treaty law from cutting across the rights given the American people by the constitution and bill of rights.

Rep. Con presented to the Congress a memorial passed recently by the Oregon legislature recommending this amendment.

"The congressman said he was particularly interested in calling this memorial to Congress, because he had only recently resigned from the Oregon Senate to become a member of Congress. He added: 'I believe that question should be settled in clear and unquestionable language, for all time, that treaty power cannot be used for purposes in conflict with our constitution.'

"We must not allow a loophole to remain in our constitution which might make possible the change of our form of government by per-

mitting international agreements to come in and level out our American rights, both state and individual."

Rep. Con added that he did not think this country could afford to lower standards of human liberty in order to compromise with godless and socialist members of other nations, but rather should endeavor to bring them up to our standards.

In the past year alone, Rep. Con said, the United States has been represented at more than 3,000 international meetings where agreements of all types have been discussed and in some instances favored, by our own delegates to those meetings. Such international agreements might well authorize what the constitution forbids, and thus supercede the constitution.

13 Killed In Brewery Holocaust

NEWARK, N. J. (AP)—The death toll in a fire at the Anheuser-Busch brewery yesterday has been fixed at 13. All the victims were construction workers who suffocated when trapped in a maze of huge fermentation tanks.

Fire raced up the cork-lined walls of a windowless storage wing at the 20 million dollar brewery. Black choking smoke filled the six-story brick wing, touching

off panic among the 80 men at work there. Twenty-nine were hospitalized for smoke poisoning.

Light couldn't pierce the thick curtain of smoke in the wing, and the workmen groped blindly for exits.

About half of the victims were caught inside the 30 by 50-foot fermentation tanks. Small manholes just a little more than two feet in diameter were the only exits

from the tanks. "Those in the tanks were trapped like rats," said Foreman Fred Watkins. "They probably never heard the fire warning, and if they did, they couldn't have made it

Armed Robbery Brings Death

ATLANTA (AP)—Howard Leroy Booker, 33, was sentenced yesterday to die May 1 in the electric chair for a robbery that brought him only \$1.50 and two streetcar tokens.

Mrs. Sarah Babbitt, 28, testified the defendant dragged her into a tangled thicket, "beat, stomped and cut" her and fled with her purse containing the small sum of money and the two tokens.

Court officials said it was the second time in the history of Atlanta courts that the death sentence has been given for armed robbery.

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
