

Senator Asks 'Voice' Curb

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Fulbright (D-Ark.) said today Voice of America broadcasts have long been overemphasized and should be curtailed in favor of other government efforts to counter Communist propaganda.

The Voice's short-wave broadcasts from this country, other than those in nations behind the Iron Curtain, "could be greatly reduced if not cut out altogether," he said in an interview.

Senate investigations of the Voice were endorsed by Senate Republican Leader Taft of Ohio when the subject came up during a CBA-TV panel program yesterday.

Taft said he "never felt the Voice presentation of America was right." He commented that the agency "certainly was full of fellow travelers," and added: "I'd have fired the whole Voice of America setup."

Fulbright is a member, and former chairman, of a Senate foreign relations subcommittee that began an inquiry last summer into Voice and other activities of the State Department's International Information Administration (IIA). In recent weeks a search for any waste or subversion in the program has been undertaken by the Senate investigations subcommittee led by Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.). Both groups have been conducting hearings simultaneously.

The foreign relations subcommittee, now headed by Sen. Hickenlooper (R-Iowa), called another hearing today while McCarthy's unit was in recess.

Name Switched, Meaning Same

SEOUL (AP) — When Gen. James A. Van Fleet turned over the U. S. Eighth Army to Lt. Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor last month, the deal included a C47 transport plane named Nike.

Nike is the Greek word for victory, and Van Fleet used it on his personal plane to commemorate his service in Greece against the Communists.

Taylor has changed the plane's name — but the meaning is the same. It's now called the Sungni, the Korean word for victory.

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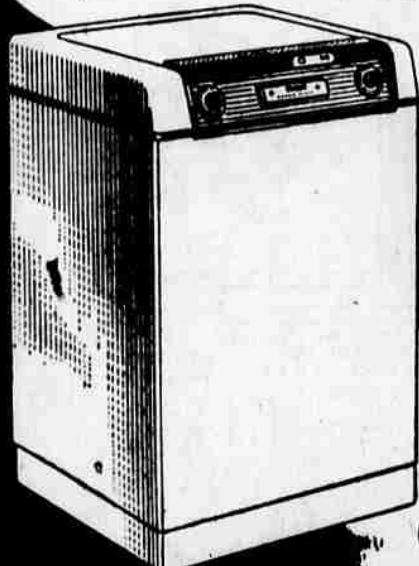
