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Klamath Camp Fire Girls To Observe Birthday

Camp Fire Girls in Klamath join in the nation's celebration of Camp Fire's 43rd birthday the week of March 15-21. However, due to Spring vacation week falling on the above dates, Klamath Falls Council has postponed activities here until the week of March 22-28, according to Naomi French, executive director.

In line with the Birthday Week program, Camp Fire Girls will highlight their 1933 birthday project, "Down to Earth," a theme which will keynote their year-round activities. "Down to Earth," a National project in which more than 370,000 other Camp Fire Girls throughout the country are participating, will give girls an opportunity to make a first hand study of the soil and the things that grow in it and on it.

Although "Down to Earth" will be carried out in many ways, Mrs. French said that participation in the project will help Camp Fire Girls to achieve several basic objectives, namely, to broaden their appreciation of the world in which they live to increase their knowledge of nature and develop powers of observation. Highlighting the Klamath Council plans for birthday week will be radio appearances by members of various groups. Exhibits in many of the town merchants' windows of Camp Fire's seven crafts girls study in order to earn coveted ranks, and a joint Council Fire where awards are given to each girl making their ranks.
