Mr. and Mrs. Rex Underwood of Portland University will be in Klamath Falls March 27, when Mr. Underwood will present Wayne Angel to the public at the scholarship concert to be held at Mills auditorium. Mrs. Underwood will appear as a guest soloist in the program.

Mr. Underwood, Wayne's present teacher, is Professor of Violin and Orchestra on the teaching staff of the University of Portland. Since joining the University, Mr. Underwood has served as president of the Portland Branch of Oregon Music Teachers' Association, as Northwest chairman of the MENC Special String Projects Committee, and as National president of the American String Teachers Association.
