Drive Launched Seeking Funds To Fight Cancer In US; Local Plans Outlined

A drive to raise \$18,000,000 throughout the U.S. to fight cancer was launched today in Klamath County.

The announcement was accompanied by a statement from Keith O'Hair, campaign chairman of the ACS organization and a message from ACS division officials.

The campaign gets rolling here with the following program: Campaign volunteers have already been contacted throughout the county. Neighborhood "coffee parties" will be in progress all during April. Each neighbor and friend invited

to the home of a "coffee party" sponsor, will bring a dollar to donate to the cancer crusade. You will want to participate—a hostess—and for further details contact one of the volunteer workers in your community.

In Klamath Falls, co-sponsoring this crusade is the Jaycees. Mrs. Earl McGaughey, chairman, and the Business and Professional Women, with Mrs. Blanche Petroff as chairman. Other county volunteers include Mrs. Cavan, Mrs. Harry Oberchain and Mrs. L. L. Griffin of Bly, Mrs. Owen Pepple, Bonanza, Mrs. W. Harris, Langell Valley, Mrs. William Taylor, Chemult, Mrs. Souers, Chiloquin, Mrs. Don Veatch, Ft. Klamath, Victor Sisson and T. W. Sanders, Klamath Agency, Mrs. George Mason, Keno Mrs. Ben Pickett, Malin, Business and Professional Women of Merrill, chairmaned by Mrs. F. E. Trotman.

"The key to success in fighting cancer," O'Hair said, "is the volunteer worker. On the eve of this 1953 crusade I want to pay tribute to the volunteers in Klamath County who will shoulder the task of raising funds and informing people how they can best guard against cancer. We have been assigned a goal of \$5,000 as our share in the National campaign. We can with a very little effort, exceed our quota. I am sure that all the residents of this community will join me in this objective."

An early afternoon message from the Oregon Division of the American Cancer Society was received praising the local unit for its prompt start in the campaign. "You are to be congratulated for your promising beginning," Mrs. Virginia Kietzer, division chairman and state commander, wrote. Your share of our division's goal of \$350,000 is vitally important. Every contribution, even as little as a dime, is helpful. Ten cents buys a test tube. Twenty dollars will support a research bed for one day. Five hundred dollars will buy a special microscope and \$65,000 will provide a million volt X-ray machine.

"We know everyone will support the crusade with increased response this year." Of every dollar contributed to the American Cancer Society, 60 cents remains in this state for a division program, 25 cents goes to a national research program, and 15 cents is used by the national headquarters for preparing films, publications, exhibits, etc., for professional and public education; for fellowships for your physicians; for planning and supervision of a program of service to cancer patients; and for administration and fund raising.
