Escapes Freedom Brief

HOOD RIVER (AP) - Two Multnomah County prisoners escaped Tuesday, stole a car at Parkrose, east of Portland, and were nabbed near here.

The car they stole was owned by Henry A. Doellefeld who lives in Parkrose but has his business in Hood River, and commutes.

State police were notified when the car was recognized at a Cascade Locks service station where the men pulled for gas.

State Patrolmen Roland Montgomery intercepted the car, but the men eluded him, roared through Hood River, then cut south toward Parkdale with Montgomery in pursuit.

They were identified as Robert Hanson, 19, and John Draper, 20. Sheriff Terry Schunk picked them up here at 3 a.m. Wednesday.

Mass Killer Mute In Court

LONDON (AP) - An owl-eyed clerk charged with murdering his wife and under questioning about the sex-thrill strangling of at least five other women appeared briefly in a crowded court Wednesday.

Christie seemed nonchalant - even bored - with the eight-minute proceedings in the London magistrates court.

His only outward sign of emotion was a single frown in his pale brow. He made no statement.

The prisoner was guarded heavily by police and detectives. Outside the court, a crowd strained against police lines or quipped for the few available public seats in the courtroom.

Housewives carrying shopping bags and holding onto children posted for better views. Extra police were on duty both inside and outside the court.

Scores of other persons filled the windows of nearby homes and apartments, craning for a view of Christie coming and going.

Christie stepped briskly into the dock when his name and case number seven - were called. He wore a gray tweed suit and hurried spectacles.

Judge Clyde Wilson granted Scotland Yard's request that Christie be "retained" - held over for another week. Detectives want more time to probe into Christie's past and to grill him further about the mass "murder house" slayings in London's drab Notting Hill Gate district.

Christie was captured Tuesday after a seven-day nationwide manhunt - Britain's most intense since the days of Jack the Ripper. He was charged formally with the slaying of his wife, Ethel.

Police said that he had made a statement after his detention but its contents were not disclosed.

The body of Mrs. Christie, 54, was one of six female corpses so far found buried or walled up at the macabre house of murder in the drab Notting Hill district where Christie had lived since 1933.

Police believe additional bones found in the garden may belong to a seventh victim.

The investigating warden, Virgil O'Malley, to be fired - had recommended that all inmates be locked in their cells until the new administration had gone over the institution and established its control.

At 6 a.m. he and three men - a guard said they were from the federal prison system - went inside the walls on what was reported to be a fine-tooth-comb inspection.

Gladden said Tuesday night that his administration would be "dedicated to policies of modern penology, education and recreation," and "I intend to get discipline."
