WASHINGTON — Secretary of Defense Wilson has cracked down on security slips he blames on inter-service rivalry and lax handling of secret documents. Declaration of Human Rights is doing more to advance the cause of freedom — always at the heart of the American cause — than thousands of you educators could do even if we could afford to export you and train you in 47 or more different languages."

Wage Talks Bogged Down

NEW YORK — General Electric Co. and the CIO International Union of Electrical Workers (IUE) still deadlocked in a wage dispute, have set their next negotiation meeting for April 16. A company-union session ended Wednesday, stalemated over the OE cost-of-living wage offer of less than two per cent and the union "package" demand equivalent to a 21-cent-an-hour pay increase.

Butane Gas Cause Of Big Explosion

SAN FRANCISCO — Illegally stored butane gasoline caused the explosion which wrecked a three-story building, injured 11 people and caused an estimated 150,000 damage in Chinatown Wednesday, says Fire Chief Rudolph Schubert. The chief said butane tanks were stored in the basement of a plumbing shop without a permit and were "definitely in violation of the law."

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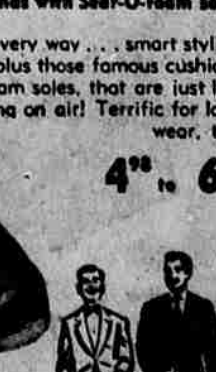


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
