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Molders Strike 17 Portland Shops

PORTLAND (AP) — Part of the metal trades industry in Portland was struck Friday by AFL Molders. Some machinists threatened to follow suit.

The molders, who have about 700 in their union here, voted to strike in 17 shops where wage agreements had not been reached.

Machinists scheduled a stop-work meeting here in the afternoon to decide whether to strike in a similar number of shops where they had failed to reach agreement with employers over replacement

of stolen tools. These developments came after the 30-shop, 10,000-employee metal trades industry here.



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
