Coastal Rivers Of Oregon Now Eyed As Potential Of Wintertime Power In NW

PORTLAND (AP) — The coastal rivers of Oregon, generally overlooked for power production, could one day provide a wintertime power source for the Northwest.

A preliminary report from R. O. Holland, regional hydraulic engineer for the Geological Survey of the Interior, warned, however, that projects might be costly—especially since a number of the necessary reservoirs would require extensive relocation of roads and rail lines.

The costs also would have to include fish ladders and hatcheries to preserve salmon runs.

Holland compiled known material on the coastal rivers, not including the Umpqua and the Rogue, which originate in the Cascades and offer power sites farther upstream.

He concluded that these nine rivers could develop around 200,000 kilowatts of year-round firm power, which might be even more valuable in meeting heavy winter demands.

Used as wintertime producers, they could generate 620,000 kilowatts at a time when Columbia River generation is at its lowest—between November and February. That is a period when rainfall is heavy in the Coast Range, and the coastal rivers are at their peak.

The rivers studied are the Nehalem, Wilson, Trask, Nestucca, Siletz, Alsea, Biallaw, the South Fork of the Coos, and the South Fork of the Coquille.

Holland ruled out the Siuslaw as being too costly for development, and recommended further study of the others so that exact costs could be weighed against expected benefits.

West Asking Med Schools

WASHINGTON (AP) — Western senators are pressing for action on a bill which would permit Western states to combine in financing medical and dental schools.

The bill was introduced last week by Sen. Hunt (D-Wyo.) and 11 other senators from Wyoming, Utah, Washington, Oregon, Colorado, Montana and New Mexico. It was referred to the Senate Labor and Public Welfare Committee.

The bill would permit the Western states and the territories of Alaska and Hawaii to form a higher education compact and set up an interstate commission for higher education.

Prime purpose of the legislation is to make it easier for Western students to attend schools of medicine, dentistry and veterinary areas which have no such schools.

"The bill is designed to make all of the higher educational facilities in the West available to the citizens from any of the 11 Western states," said Hunt, who practiced dentistry before he became a senator.

"This will increase the possibility for higher education on the one hand and greatly decrease costs in many states on the other hand."

Youth Crushed By Rolling Log

COTTAGE GROVE (AP) — Ten-year-old Nelson John Zeller Jr., who disappeared Saturday while playing with flowers, was found Sunday, crushed by a rolling log.

Searchers found his body about 20 yards from his home in the Ruby Creek area, four miles east here.

They speculated the boy, son of Mr. and Mrs. N. J. Zeller, had attempted to chop a log on a hillside and that the log had broken through, crushing him.
