

Medal of Honor Man on Way To Battlegrounds In Korea

PORT LEWIS (AP) — It's back to the front again for Congressional Medal of Honor winner Thomas J. McCall. The 36-year-old master sergeant from Lafayette, Ind., who has been wounded three times in the war, seen 13 years in the front and won the nation's highest military award during the Allied advance during the Battle of the Rapido River in Italy in World War II.

Explaining that his heroic exploits happened a long time ago, he remembered the details. "I remember it as a news conference," he said.

"I couldn't go back, so I went forward. No, I didn't save anyone's life."

McCall was wounded in the hip, arm and leg and finally captured and served out the rest of the war in a prisoner of the Germans.

Now at Fort Lewis, McCall is awaiting a return to the Korean fighting after volunteering again. Early in the Korean conflict, he volunteered, was seriously wounded and returned to a hospital in Japan. He slipped out to return to the front, but was picked up in Tokyo and sent back to the states.

Itching for action, he's anxious to get back to it.

"I like combat," he said. "It's the excitement. I reckon I'm not a Stateside soldier. I think the older guys should serve in Korea. There are too many kids there."

Back home at Lafayette, his wife is "kind of unhappy" about it. As for the danger, "either you do or you don't."

His Medal of Honor citation says that while leading a machine gun section his group crossed the Rapido in face of withering machine-gun fire. He "encouraged and welded his men into an effective fighting unit," single-handedly knocking out two enemy machine-guns. When last seen, he was moving forward "firing his machine-gun from his hip."

McCall was flying the plane for the movie actor James Cagney, who also owned it when he was set his original record.

De Bona, a Beverly Hills, Calif., real estate and insurance man who had a hobby, was aiming at the record of four hours, 53 minutes, 45 seconds set by Paul Mantz two years ago.

The Californian flew the same plane in a record five hours and 45 minutes in 1949 before Mantz set his mark.

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West German Spies Busted

BONN, Germany (AP) — Vice Chancellor Franz Blumberg announced Friday the smashing of a widespread Soviet spy ring in Western Germany.

He said it was directed by Russian Army officers at Soviet headquarters in East Berlin and specialized in industrial espionage in the vital Ruhr Valley.

Blumberg said more than 35 persons—all Germans—had been arrested and more will be jailed. He termed the ring "the largest Soviet secret organization uncovered in Western Germany since

the beginning of the occupation in 1945."

Blumberg said the ring was disguised under the name "Institute for Economic Research" and had been operating for several months.

University Cracks Down

PULLMAN (AP) — A newly-proposed policy says no University of Washington staff member may retain his position if he refuses to tell proper authorities whether or not he is a Communist.

President Henry Schmitz, addressing the Pacific Northwest Conference on Banking Thursday night, said the institution was "in the forefront in establishing that a member of the Communist party is not an acceptable member of the staff."

He added: "During recent weeks another principle has been established. Any member of the staff who refused to answer questions regarding Communist Party membership put to him by a duly constituted public body forfeits the privilege of holding a University post."

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He went on to say that the University "must not renounce our democratic faith and yield to the idea that all unorthodox and unpopular opinions are necessarily subversive."



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Trouble Ends Try At Record

PORT WAYNE, Ind. (AP) — Ignoring trouble and a dry oil line, Joe de Bona's attempt to regain the transcontinental speed record for propeller planes ended in failure.

The 40-year-old pilot landed at Port Wayne's Barr Field a few minutes after he took off from Los Angeles, Calif., in a redesigned Mustang.

"I'm pretty disgusted," De Bona said. "I figured I had the record."

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
