Using as his topic, "Your Value as Lions or As Individuals," Dr. Stevenson dwelt on what constitutes one's value or importance. He said that much is found in literature on the conservation of natural resources but very little on conservation of human life. Agency Soil Unit To Meet

BEATTY—The Soil and Moisture Division at Klamath Agency has been invited to participate in the weekly community meeting to be held in the Community Recreation Hall here, Monday, 7:30 p.m. The meeting is being planned by Jesse L. Kirk.

The soil and moisture program was recently activated on the Klamath Reservation to assist Indian land operators in conservation and to offer them the services of expert agriculture technicians.

The technical personnel now includes Robert E. Butler, agricultural engineer, Jack Shumaker, soil scientist, and William M. Rogers, conservationist. Many farmers have availed themselves of these services to reorganize irrigation systems, level land for better water utilization and other phases of ranching.

Other community meetings have been held at Williamson River and Beatty to acquaint farmers with the conservation program. Movies, colored slides and posters are to be employed in demonstrating better conservation practices. The public is invited.

Snowpack Said Near Normal

ALTURAS—Forest Officers Don Tyler, Robert Hays and Harry Taylor report that although mountain snow in this area measures somewhat less than last year's depths, snowpack conditions are near normal.

The officers last week completed a survey in the Warner Mountains.

They report Cedar Pass had an average of 41 inches, with 18 per cent water content. On the Eagle Peak course, it was 40 inches and 14.7 per cent water. Blue Lake course had 34 inches with 10 per cent water.

Highways To Be Improved

PORTLAND (AP)—The State Highway Commission completed action Thursday on another 4 1/2 million dollars in highway jobs.

Engineer R. H. Baldock, expected pleasure at the bids, saying they ran 6 per cent under costs estimated before the two-day meeting of the Highway Commission opened here.

Contracts were awarded for all low bids received Thursday with these changes:

Curry — Stockpile materials on Mussel Creek — Hunter Creek Road production project, Oregon Coast Highway. All bids rejected as too high.

Jackson — Construction of two concrete bridges on Tolo-Camp White access road west of Gold Hill, Babler Bros., Portland, \$72,512.

Josephine — Paving, widening and grading 5.43 miles south of Wolf Creek, plus Azalea — Jumpoff Joe Creek rock production project, \$111,065, J. C. Compton Co., McMinnville.

Klamath Grog Tags Okayed

PORTLAND (AP)—The Oregon Liquor Commission approved Thursday the first 74 licenses for liquor by the drink. By the end of the year the total is expected to reach 640.

The Turn Around Inn at Roseburg got the first license as the commission began sifting through the applications. The commission set meetings for Portland, April 23, and Salem, April 24, to consider further applications.

Liquor by the drink goes into operation May 4.

All those approved Thursday already held licenses to serve mixed drinks under the bottle privilege. The commission said it would continue to process applications from mixed-drink license holders. There are 540 of these.

After that the commission will take up applications from places not having bottle privileges.

BOND CUT — Roseburg (AP)—Bail for Donald S. Partin, accused of manslaughter, was reduced Thursday from \$20,000 to \$10,000, and he was released after posting the necessary bond.

Partin is accused of knocking William Kelly down in a fight Saturday after a traffic mishap, Kelly died.

A preliminary hearing is scheduled for Partin next week.

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US Prisoner Count Waits End Of War

WASHINGTON (AP)—Only peace in Korea will disclose how many of the 2,154 Americans currently listed as missing in action will return alive from Communist prison camps.

If the Reds prove correct in their claim more than a year ago that they hold about 3,000 U.S. prisoners, the ratio of captured to missing will be one to three.

The U.S. records, however, list only 2,322 Americans captured, based partly on letters received from captive Americans.

In World War II, 131,000 Americans became prisoners of the enemy. Of these, 15,000—or less than one-tenth—died in captivity. This compared with 185,000 reported missing by the U.S. after deductions for numbers determined to have died in action.

In the Korean War the total reported missing in action is 13,095. Of these, 1,393 subsequently returned to U.S. control, 224 are known to have died and 2,322 are believed captured. The remaining 9,156 are listed as currently missing. No accurate figures are available from World War II to show how many American prisoners of the enemy were sick or injured during captivity.

Takewise, there is no official information at the Pentagon about how many Americans in Red prison camps today are sick, injured or still suffering from wounds. Letters from war prisoners are, of course, highly censored. Individuals know their best chance to get

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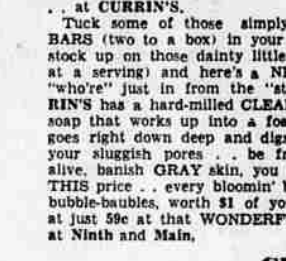
