Two Armories Get Go Ahead

Congressman Sam Coon, announced from Washington today that two armory projects at Baker and Milwaukie have been released from the construction freeze.

Congressman Coon had previously worked in behalf of these projects while he served as Senator in the Oregon State Legislature, and he was largely responsible for securing State approval for the Baker project. He has now been able to obtain approval in Washington for these projects to be released from the freeze order that was issued about March 1st by the Secretary of Defense.

Bids for construction of these two Oregon projects had been completed before the freeze took effect. The award of contracts to the successful bidders can now be made. Contracts will be drawn up and submitted to the National Guard Bureau in Washington for approval. When the contracts are approved, construction can then go forward, which may be within thirty days.

At Baker an armory addition, office quarters, and supply room will be made to the motor vehicle storage building. Milwaukie-Freewater will be the first city in Oregon to have the new type single unit armory. These armories are being constructed through cooperation of the Federal Government and the State of Oregon, with a ratio of 75 per cent federal funds and 25 per cent state funds.
