## Senators Hear Tale Of Ridgway Veto On Van Fleet Plan For Offensive

WASHINGTON (AP) — Senators have been told that Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway turned down Gen. James A. Van Fleet's plan for an Allied seaborne strike against the Communists in Korea in June, 1951.

Van Fleet, then commander of the U. S. Eighth Army in Korea, recently told a Senate armed services subcommittee he was "trying to turn me loose" for such an assault, but that higher authority would not approve it.

Van Fleet, now retired, said he felt he could have destroyed the Chinese armies with the blow.

At the time Van Fleet gave that testimony, Ridgway said in Paris he had "absolutely no comment" in June, 1951, he was Far Eastern commander; he is now commander of Western European defense forces.

Gen. J. Lawton Collins, Army chief of staff, testified behind closed doors yesterday afternoon to the armed services subcommittee, which has been investigating reported ammunition shortages.

Later, a senator who asked that his name not be used told reporters:

"Collins said the Van Fleet recommendation never reached the Joint Chiefs of Staff for a decision. He said Ridgway turned it down because he felt it was too

**Perjury Case Guilt Found**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Herschel Young was convicted Monday night of swearing falsely when he told a Grand Jury in 1951 he had never represented Reconstruction Finance Corporation (RFC) loan seekers.

Young, 49, is an older brother of A. Merl Young, a central figure in an investigation of alleged influence and favoritism in RFC operations who was convicted of perjury March 31.

A U. S. District Court jury of nine men and three women convicted Herschel Young on one of five charges of perjury. The jury had reached no verdict on two other charges but was discharged when William A. Paisley, the chief government prosecutor, agreed to dismiss those counts. Two remaining charges were dropped by the government before the case went to the jury.

Young contended he never represented anyone before the RFC, but conceded he had accompanied loan seekers to the agency on several occasions. He said he did this in his role as a Washington "leg-man or messenger boy" for business concerns, but that he left the talking to others.

U. S. District Judge Alexander Holtzoff allowed Young to remain free on \$1,000 bail pending sentencing. No date for sentencing was set. The maximum penalty is two to 10 years in prison.

Merl Young has filed a motion for a new trial. This is scheduled to be argued Friday. If it is denied he will be sentenced April 30.
