Doctor Cleared Of Abortion

SALEM — A circuit court jury acquitted Dr. Sierman R. Smith, 65, Woodburn chiropractor, of a charge of manslaughter by abortion here Thursday.

The jury deliberated 3 1/2 hours before returning its unanimous verdict to free Smith of the charge of performing an abortion on a Salem-area woman last February.

Britons Get Together In Attempt To Save Old Ship

LONDON — A campaign has started to save the Cutty Sark, last of the true clippers, from the breakers' yard.

It comes just in time. The old square rigger, 503 tons and beautiful even at her advanced age of 84, swings at her mooring in the Thames near Greenwich. Near her chug the cargo tramps, tugs and lighters that now carry the commerce of the port of London.

The Cutty Sark's paint is cracked and blistered. Her steel cables and anchor chain are rusty. Her masts and standing rigging that once towered to cathedral height, show signs of rot.

The Cutty Sark Preservation Society, under the patronage of the Duke of Edinburgh, has appealed for 250,000 pounds (\$700,000) to save the ship. About 45,000 pounds (\$125,000) already have been subscribed or promised.

The plan is to recondition and re-rig the old windjammer and place her in a permanent dry berth near the Royal Naval College at Greenwich. There she would serve as a permanent memorial to the British mercantile marine.

In the evolution of sailing vessels, the clipper was the finest and almost the last development. Ships of this type were developed first in America. They had yacht-like lines, low freeboard and were square-rigged on each of their masts.

In the middle of the last century American clippers were queens of the sea. The Cutty Sark was one of the few British ships that could compete with the Yankee clippers. She always held her own.

Mac Hi Building Bond Vote Due

MILTON-FREEWATER — Issuance of \$295,000 in bonds to build a physical education plant, including an indoor swimming pool, at Mac Hi, will be voted on here May 25.

Ward Hammerley, school superintendent, said Thursday that although it was a school project to be decided by the district voters, it was planned to make it a community facility if built. A full-time recreational director would be employed, he said, and the pool would be open during the summer months for public use.

Ike Has Plans For Import-Export Bank

WASHINGTON — President Eisenhower Thursday sent Congress a reorganization plan designed to strengthen administration of the export-import bank, which makes commodity loans.

The plan calls for placing a single managing director at the head of the bank. Its management now is vested in a board of directors made up of four full-time members and the secretary of state as an ex officio member.

Body of Fisherman Found in River

BOARDMAN Ore. — The body of Dale Hug, 24, Boardman man who drowned in a Columbia River boating mishap on March 8, was recovered Wednesday at Lyle, Wash.

Hug's father and brother went to White Salmon, where the body was taken, and made the identification. It will be returned here.

In the mishap eight weeks ago, Hug's companion, Archie Jones, was saved when their boat overturned in the wake of a passing tug.

CE Convention Opens Sessions

MILTON-FREEWATER — The state Christian Endeavor opened its 61st Oregon convention here Thursday with nearly 500 delegates attending.

Convention lecturer for the four-day session is the Rev. Harlow Willard, pastor of the Sunnyside, Wash., Presbyterian church. Participating are Presbyterian, Baptist, Congregational, Methodist, Evangelical - Reformed, United Brethren, Christian and Evangelical churches.

WAGE INCREASE

PORTLAND — Drivers for the Portland Traction Co. voted Thursday night to accept a 5 1/2 percent hourly wage increase.

H. I. Thomas, union business agent, said the agreement offered by employers also raised pensions \$5 monthly to a total of \$60.

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Testimony Of Durkin Requested

WASHINGTON — Sen. Murray (D-Mont.) told the Senate Labor Committee Thursday that its hearings on revision of the Taft-Hartley law will be "incomplete and inadequate" unless Secretary of Labor Durkin is called to testify.

He made a formal motion at the start of the day's session, billed in advance as the last public hearing on the measure, that Durkin be summoned to give the administrative views on how the law should be changed.

Sen. Goldwater (R-Ariz.), acting committee chairman in the absence of Sen. H. Alexander Smith (R-N.J.), told Murray his motion would be taken up at the first executive session of the full committee, possibly within the next few days.

Murray criticized the failure of Durkin or any other administration official to testify and said it was "an altogether unique experience—the first time in my senatorial career in which a senate committee has held extensive hearings... Without the benefit of the experience and advice of the executive branch of the government."

Goldwater said the Senate hearings would recess Thursday but "that doesn't preclude the possibility that additional witnesses will be called if their advice is deemed necessary to the committee's work."

Durkin, a Democrat who is now on leave as President of the AFL-Plumbers Union, was committed to all-out repeal of the law before President Eisenhower put him in the cabinet as labor secretary.

Since then, he has said the law simply needs amending.

Go-Out Pay Ban Voted

WASHINGTON — The House Thursday passed a bill to bar lump-sum cash payments to cabinet officials and other top level government workers when they leave office.

The bill was approved by voice vote, with no apparent opposition.

"It's time these fellows got all four feet out of the feed trough," declared Rep. Rees (R-Ian), author of the proposal.

The House action was touched off by disclosures that 215 top government officials of the Truman administration, including some former cabinet members, collected more than \$700,000 in lump-sum payments in lieu of unused vacations and other leave to which they were entitled.

No Tax Cut In Sight To Date

WASHINGTON — House Speaker Martin (R-Mass.) said the spending cuts President Eisenhower Thursday were "not enough yet to assure a tax reduction."

Martin told reporters he was encouraged and was hopeful the federal budget might be balanced.

"We have seen substantial cuts in the Truman budget," he said, "but not enough yet to assure a tax reduction."

Martin added that he has not abandoned hope of a tax cut this year, but is determined to have a balanced budget in sight before tax reduction is considered.
