Two Hurt In Plant Blast

PORTLAND (AP) — Two men were injured in an explosion at the Pacific Steel Foundry here Monday night. They are Raphael J. Koessler, 37, who suffered severe burns on his face, arms and body, and George P. Adams, 43, who suffered minor burns. Koessler's condition Tuesday was fair; Adams was treated and released. Fire Chief Leo Weidner said a gas leak containing 50 gallons of gas from an 11,000-volt transformer ignited. The force of the blast blew down two steel doors and all of the plant's roof. Windows in the plant were broken and the blast was felt over wide areas. Damage was estimated by Weidner at about \$4,000. The transformer was not damaged and work continued at the plant through the night. It makes slings of alloy steels and employs about 800 men. Dan James, which had collected the switch were believed responsible for the explosion.

Former Deputy Warden Passes

SALEM (AP) — Eugene C. Halley, 70, who retired last July 1 as deputy warden of the Oregon State Penitentiary, died in a Salem hospital Monday night.

Halley, who was deputy warden 31 years, had been ill with a heart ailment for several months.

Halley became deputy warden in 1921, when the prison had only 400 convicts—one-fourth as many as it now has.

Halley had a reputation for firm discipline and fairness.

He leaves a widow, who is ill in a nursing home, and a sister, Mrs. Ernestine McNeerney, Salem. The Halleys had no children.

ster and keeping him awake, Dr. Melitta Sperling of the State University of New York Medical Center told the American Psychiatric Association yesterday.

He cited the case of an over-indulgent mother who was so afraid of her boy's crying that she hired a helper to sit with him through the nights.

Dr. Sperling told the mother to let him cry. The mother said she would be evicted if she did that. Dr. Sperling gave her a certificate saying it was necessary. It worked. Three years later the boy was sleeping normally.

Dr. Sperling also told of a woman whose overcarefulness of her 6-month-old baby disguised a feeling of hostility. She would lean over the crib to make sure he was breathing; would fuss with the bed clothes, and awaken the child, then take him out of his bed.

The mother had to be made to realize her attitude was respon-

ble, Dr. Sperling said. There was a 10-year-old girl who stayed awake until early morning, then slept until she would be late for school. Dr. Sperling found that

as a baby the girl had been given hourly bottle feedings during the night because the mother thought the child's stomach was small. The girl drank a quart of milk during

sleeping hours, and when the feedings were stopped she developed serious insomnia. Spankings and sedatives did no good. Psychiatric treatment straightened her out.
