Q—Are people who wear glasses normally more prone to headaches from 3-D?

A—Not if their glasses correct their eyes in normal vision.

Q—Can 3-D be perfected so it won't cause headaches?

A—Yes, we can eventually reach that stage—if the cameramen and projectionists adhere to the proper formulas.

Q—Is 3-D possible without glasses?

A—There is no such method known to us now. You must use both eyes to see depth. That means that each eye must see a slightly different picture. In movies that requires projecting two pictures, one for each eye, plus special glasses to give the illusion of depth.

Q—Is there anything new about these dimensional techniques?

A—No. The 3-D effect was achieved many years ago by the use of glasses with green and red lenses; now polarized glasses are used. We filmed a picture in wide and normal screen at RKO 20 years ago, but there was no need for them; business was good. Now we need something to get people back into the theaters.

Q—Which system do you think will triumph?

A—I think most pictures will be in wide-screen. It gives more scope to the screen and is excellent for outdoor scenes. I believe the novelty of 3-D will wear off in a year or so. Its main asset is that it adds something to reality.
