Long Strike Ends Today

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The two-day strike against the Southern California Edison Co. ended Monday with the company and AFL-CIO workers reaching a temporary agreement. By a majority of eight to five, the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers voted to accept Edison's offer of a temporary agreement so that negotiations can be resumed immediately on a work contract. The local has 70 members. The national, the longest system-wide strike against an electric utility in the nation's history, began April 10. Although power service in Southern California was not interrupted, three rivers were dynamited and both sides complained of the National Labor Relations board of violence and discrimination. Under the temporary agreement, workers will receive a pay increase of 5 per cent or \$15 a week, whichever is greater.

Draper Quits As Economic Advisor

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Truman Monday accepted the resignation of William H. Draper, Jr., as his special representative to Europe for economic assistance. The White House also announced the resignation of Howard K. Tamm as ambassador to Haiti. Tamm gave up his post for health reasons. Both resignations are effective May 30. No successor was announced to either man.
