## Livestock

**PORTLAND LIVESTOCK**  
PORTLAND (U-USA) - Cattle salable 300, market active, about same as Tuesday's advance; cows strong to 50 cents higher, around same loads choice \$23-24; 1 1/2 red steers 20.00-25.00; pair load choice 11.75-12.50; scattered but good steers 23.00-25.00; low commercial-good heifers 20.00-22.25; choice 725 lb heifers 24.00; canner and cutter cows mostly 11.00-13.00; few 13.50; utility cows 14.00-15.00; commercial cows to 16.75; utility and commercial bulls 17.00-19.00.

**CHICAGO** - A setback in livestock receipts helped strengthen prices Wednesday on the heels of Tuesday's moderate weakness.

Hogs were steady to 25 cents higher. Most sales were at \$23.50 to \$24.65 on barrows and gilts. Sows mostly made \$20.50 to \$23.50. Cattle moved steady to 50 cents higher. Good to low-grade steers and yearlings made a market at \$19.50 to \$23.50 and prime kinds went on up to \$23.75 to \$24.50. Cows topped at \$18.25.

A steady tone prevailed in sheep. Both shorn and wooled lambs brought \$23.00 and below while ewes sold from \$7.00 downward. A few native spring lambs reached \$24.00 for choice and prime grades. Estimated valuable receipts totaled 7,000 head, 11,000 cattle, 500 calves and 1,000 sheep.

**TULLELAKE** - "It's the same Johnny," according to Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Martin, parents of John Martin, out of a prison camp and home from Korea, Mr. and Mrs. Martin and Johnny's two sisters, Vera and Betty and a brother, Sammy, returned Tuesday night from San Francisco where they visited Johnny in Letterman hospital.

The 23-year-old 130-pound son "looked as good as he did when he went into the service three years ago according to his family but Johnny has a touch of malaria and jaundice that is making his liver "kick up" and Army doctors will keep him under observation for the next two or three weeks before allowing him to come home for the community welcome that awaits him.

He didn't talk very much about his experience in Camp 3 where the communists held him for many months and thought the striped man in his upper back and shoulder had "probably all worked out" during the months he was held prisoner.

Army hospital authorities were very thoughtful according to Mr. and Mrs. Martin, providing a room for the family to sleep.

The purse for Johnny, that friends are raising continues to grow and the cash will be presented when he is able to come home.

## Potatoes

At Portland Monday the supply was liberal. The demand was moderate and the market for old crop potatoes was about steady while the new crop potatoes were slightly stronger. Brokers sales of California long white potatoes, U. S. No. 1 A, brought 4.00 to 4.60 a 100 pound sack.

At San Francisco there were no brokers sales reported of either the old crop or the new crop potatoes.

At Los Angeles street sales of new crop long white potatoes brought 3.25 to 3.50 for the U. S. No. 1 A grade. Sales of old crop Russets, U. S. No. 1 A, brought in from Idaho, were quoted at 4.25 to 4.75 a 100 pound sack. A few were as high as 5.25. Some also brought 3.75 to 4.00. Klamath bakers, U. S. No. 1 A, brought 4.75 to 5.00 a 100 pound sack.

At Chicago the potato supply was light for the old crop potatoes. The demand was good and the market was slightly stronger. Track sales of Idaho Russets brought around 5.25 to 5.35 a 100 pound sack for the U. S. No. 1 A, washed potatoes. Oregon Russets, U. S. No. 1 A, made 5.10 a hundredweight. Street sales of Idaho Russets, U. S. No. 1 A grade, were quoted at 5.40 to 5.75 a 100 pound sack. The supply of new crop potatoes was light. The demand was good and the market was slightly stronger. California long white potatoes, U. S. No. 1 A, brought 4.75 to 5.00 a 100 pound sack.

Total shipments of potatoes over the weekend amounted to 1251 cars throughout the nation. Of this number the Pacific Northwest shipped 122 cars, Idaho moved 89 cars and Oregon 23 cars.

Track holdings at the 16 major cities of the nation Monday amounted to 632 cars of old potatoes and 392 cars of new potatoes. This compares with 551 cars of old potatoes and 410 cars of new potatoes on track one week ago.

## Court Upsets Oregon Will

**SALEM** - The Oregon Supreme Court Wednesday upset a will in which Manlius R. Day, who lived in a cabin near Bay City in Tillamook County, left \$18,000 to Leo C. Harkey, a close friend.

The decision holds that the money goes to Day's cousins because Harkey exercised undue influence upon Day.

Day was a 51-year-old bachelor who committed suicide. Harkey, a few hours before Day killed himself, called an attorney to his home and told the lawyer how to draw the will leaving the estate to Harkey.

Then Harkey and the lawyer went to Day's cabin and Day signed the will.

The suit concerning the will was brought by Romeo Day and other cousins against Harkey. Circuit Judge R. Frank Peters of Tillamook threw the will out, and the Supreme Court decision upheld him.

Justice Harold J. Warner wrote the opinion that a lawyer should have a private interview with the person making the will.

## BANNED
