## Family Row Ends With Fatal Shot

TACOMA (AP) — Barkley Bracey had the last word in an argument with his mother over whether he should be allowed to drive the family car — he shot her, even though his eyes were so blurred with tears he couldn't aim "very much."

Still crying, the 18-year-old told Pierce County Sheriff Harold Bird Thursday night of the death of his mother in their suburban home after an argument of several months duration.

He signed the confession hours after a neighbor lady found Bracey sitting in the family home, sobbing bitterly, his head propped in his hands.

"I killed my mother," Mrs. C. O. Gallher said he told her.

In a closet, covered with a sheet was the body of Mrs. Ruth Dove, 40, the mother whose second husband, Martin Dove, is an Army sergeant stationed in Germany.

The argument Thursday started while Mrs. Dove was painting the bathroom.

"I got real mad, probably the maddest I ever got," Bracey related in his confession. "and I raised my voice quite a little bit. She got mad and raised her voice..."

"If I hadn't done that she would have lived."

He then told of putting the water, changing his clothes, cause there was blood on the floor, and what he did to find her.

No charges have been filed against the youth.

## Statehood For Alaska Approved

WASHINGTON (AP) — Legislation to give statehood to Alaska was approved Friday by the House territorial subcommittee by a 12 to 5 vote.

Chairman Saylor (R-Pa.) of the subcommittee said he expects approval soon by the full House Interior Committee, possibly when it meets next Tuesday.

The subcommittee wrote into the bill a provision to give Alaska its choice of 100 million acres of land not subject to federal withdrawal and twenty-five years to select the acreage.

It also approved a grant of 15 million dollars to Alaska upon admission as a state. The money would be used to build roads and harbors and for survey work. This is a reduction from the 30 million dollars originally proposed.

## Wreckage Clue Proves False

EVERETT (AP) — The "plane wreckage" a private flyer spotted in the Cascade Mountains turned out to be a mass of sticks and stones churned up by a falling tree.

Sheriff Tom Warnock said a search party sent to the index area in belief the "wreckage" might be that of a Navy patrol plane missing since Jan. 78 returned with the report a falling tree knocked over others, leaving a swath that from the air resembled that left by a crashed plane.

The missing plane carried 10 persons. It disappeared on a flight from Alameda, Calif., to Windy Island, Wash.

## Dog Track Issue Hot

EUGENE (AP) — A group of Eugene businessmen plan to apply for a 60-day dog racing season at a proposed track here, but increasing opposition made it appear almost certain that the permit would not be granted.

Dr. Frank R. Menne, state racing commission chairman, said in Portland Thursday that the commission is "not going to act contrary to public opinion."

Latest opposition to the track came in a resolution passed Wednesday by the Lane County Court. Previously opposition came from Eugene City Council and church and other groups.

Dr. Menne said that while the commission is not bound by law to do so, it would abide by the recommendations of local groups.

"We don't want to foist off on the people something they don't want," he said.

Spencer R. Collins, one of the track backers, said the group had decided at a meeting to present the application at a public hearing to be held in Eugene Friday afternoon by the racing commission.

## Trawler Said Out of Danger

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — The fishing trawler Bering Sea, earlier reported in danger of sinking off the Northern California coast, is out of danger, the Coast Guard said Friday.

The Coast Guard cutter Chau-tauqua reached the trawler off Point Arena, about 64 miles north of the Golden Gate, at 8 p. m. Thursday. It radioed that a line would be secured to the stricken vessel at daylight, then towed to shore.

The trawler, operating out of Tacoma, Wash. and reported heading for Central American waters, was caught in rolling seas early Thursday.

Its fuel, water and oil pumps were fouled by 35-foot waves. Motor lifeboats, attempting to aid the Bering Sea, were forced back.

Ten persons were aboard the trawler.

## Four Claimed To Be Reds

SEATTLE (AP) — Four of seven persons charged with subversion in a Federal Court trial here again been identified by a witness as having attended Communist Party functions.

The witness, James H. Taylor, was the fourth to appear for the government as an admitted former Communist. He said he was a member from 1943 until late 1945.

During that time, he related, he attended a Communist meeting in Seattle which was attended by Henry P. Huff, William J. Pennock, Terry Pettus and Mrs. Barbara Hertle. All are defendants in the trial.

The purpose of the meeting, Taylor told the court, was to hear him report on a Young Communist League meeting he had attended in New York. He also told of attending bi-weekly meetings of the Communist Party in a local hall.

## Fish Research Funds Pledged

WASHINGTON (AP) — Rep. Tolleson (R-Wash.) says he has received assurance that "a fair portion" of Pacific Coast fishery research funds will be reinstated in the Fish and Wildlife Service program for the year beginning July 1.

He made the statement after appearing before a Senate interior appropriations subcommittee Thursday.

The House, Tolleson said, eliminated some \$300,000 from fishery research funds when it passed the Interior Department appropriation bill.

He said the House cuts would affect operation of the research vessel John H. Cobb, operations of the University of Washington and Ketchikan technological laboratories and the Commercial Fisheries review, a publication informing domestic fishermen on activities of foreign competitors.

## Meat Market Strike Seen

PORTLAND (AP) — All of Portland's major meat markets may be shut down by Saturday in a dispute between AFL meatcutters and an employers' association.

Markets in small independent stores are expected to stay open.

The closure is expected to come if the union begins picketing Safeway Stores Friday. Safeway began circulating meat orders Wednesday in anticipation of the picketing. The union said picket signs were being printed.

Other stores in the association said they would send butchers home if Safeway is picketed.

Negotiations broke down Monday, with employers blaming a union demand for premium pay after 6 p. m. and for a standby meatcutter in self-service stores.
