Probation Case Held To Saturday

Circuit Judge David Vandenberg late this morning recessed the probation revocation case of Larry Witt, 30, until 10 o'clock tomorrow morning so Witt could obtain counsel.

Dist. Atty. Frank Alderson is seeking revocation of Witt's 5-year probation on a larceny conviction in September, 1950. Alderson said as the case opened this morning he would attempt to show that Witt had violated his probation by leaving the county without permission, using intoxicants and consorting with a woman with whom he was not wed.

A pretty, 20-year-old brunette took the stand this morning and told how she had spent several days and nights recently with Witt during which they drank a great deal and shared the same room at night. The willowy, smartly dressed girl said she had come here from Texas only a few weeks ago and was working as a drive-in car-hop here when she met Witt.

With her eyes downcast and speaking in subdued tones, she told Judge Vandenberg she meant to make her home here "if Larry and I could have been married."

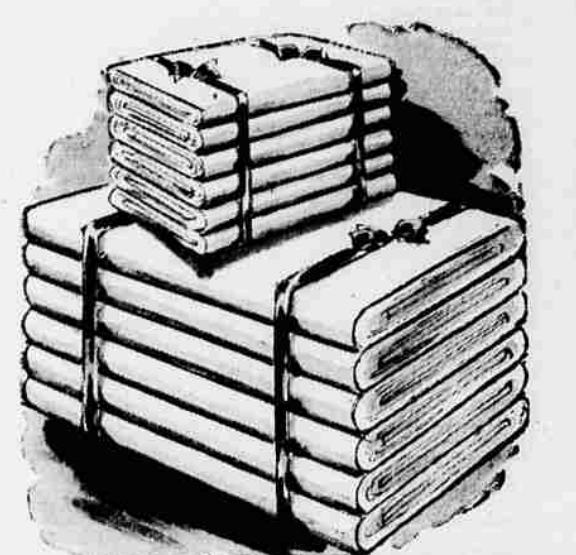
She told in detail how she and Witt had visited bars and cocktail lounges in Dorris and Fort Klamath and had continued their illicit holiday through the night.

Witt was convicted here of taking a car and going to California while the car was being held by

authorities on the basis of an attachment for unpaid debts. He was arrested at his child's home Wednesday night and jailed here on the district attorney's probation violation charge.
