funeral of Sorahan's brother, John L. Sorahan, who died of a heart attack.

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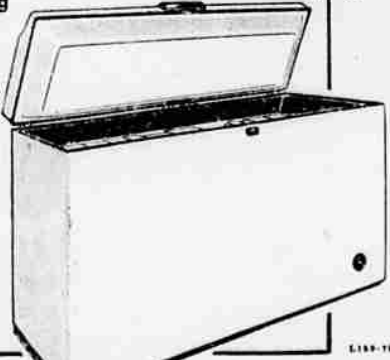


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
