County Tax Hearings Held

Although the number of persons asking for county property assessment adjustments this year is larger than usual, the number is surprisingly low in view of the circumstances. This is the opinion of County Equalization Board members who pointed out that this year 8,000 home owners have had their taxes increased in Miami.

The Equalization Board in session yesterday was confronted with 112 petitions for assessment adjustments. Some 25 persons appeared before the board to argue their cases. Many requested a re-check of their assessments and the board said these requests would be granted.

The board has two weeks in which to screen and decide on the petitions. Petitioners are to be notified of the board's decision by registered mail.

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23 Years Ago

Monday, May 19, 1930 — Fanned by a strong northwesterly wind, flames razed most of the business district of the town of Binnato this noon while businessmen looked on, helpless and unable to check the raging inferno. Starting in the blacksmith shop, owned by F. W. Bold and Son, and operated by C. S. Dice, town marshal, the fire swept on ahead of the wind, destroying the bank, the post office, Soaratori's restaurant, operated by Carl M. Lentz, the drug store, and Bradley's Mercantile Store.

Tuesday, May 20, 1930 — George Blanas, clerk at the Arcade Hotel, and his sister, Mrs. Gus Lampropoulos and children are leaving this evening for Sacramento. They plan to be gone about three weeks.

Wednesday, May 21, 1930 — A modern up-to-date grocery has been constructed on Millers' corner on the Lakeside highway by Mr. and Mrs. R. H. "Doc" Cook, and is now open for business. This store, which will be known as Idaho's Cash Store, is in charge of Mrs. Cook. Mr. and Mrs. Cook plan to make their home in living quarters in the rear of the store.

Thursday, May 22, 1930 -- Ernest M. Bubbs, newly elected president of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce to serve until May 1, 1931, is one of the most progressive and public spirited citizens of the community. Making his home in this city since 1904, Mr. Bubbs has been cashier of the American National Bank since its organization almost ten years ago.
