PORTLAND (AP)—The State Highway Commission Monday approved

California May End Up In Black

SACRAMENTO (AP)—California taxpayers had some assurance today that the state government may finish its next spending year in the black after all.

In fact, there may even be a small surplus.

It's going to depend on how much the Legislature itself votes to allow in special appropriations outside the state budget for regular operations.

The Assembly Ways and Means Committee, after cutting Gov. Warren's 1953-54 request for \$1,326,851,805 by 17½ million dollars, sent the revised bill to the lower house floor with unanimous endorsement Monday.

The committee unfroze 5½ million dollars set aside for civil defense equipment. Finance officials figured this action, coupled with the actual cuts, would leave the state in the black by \$2,525,000 a year hence, instead of the 20 million dollar deficit estimate that prompted the governor to ask for more taxes.

Sen. Ben Hulse (R-E) Centro, chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, told newsmen, however, he didn't think revenues will equal estimates made last March.

He said he expects his committee to reduce the budget by 25 to 25 million to be on the safe side.
