

### Groggy Animals Recover From Hangovers Following Dip In Booze-Filled Lake

DETROIT (AP) — Members of Belle Isle's usually peaceful animal herd Wednesday gradually shook off the effects of a four-day binge incurred by the dumping of 300 pounds of whiskey mash into a lake on the playground island.

John Jettke, of the parks and recreation department's forestry division, said deer, squirrels and birds were starting to come back to the lake.

The animals left the lake area in a somewhat woozy condition.

### Rifle Wound Proves Fatal

MILTON-FREEWATER (AP) — A man who complained he had been shot in the foot, dropped dead in a physician's office Tuesday. Then it was learned he had been shot near the heart.

He was Juan Padilla, 24, of Tulare, Calif., a worker on the Prunedale Ranch three miles north of here.

Walter Roloff, ranch owner, said he had sent Padilla and another worker, Arthur Johnson, to turn off an irrigation pump. Johnson reported that while inside the pump house, he heard a shot and stepped outside to find Padilla complaining he had shot himself in the foot with a .22 caliber rifle he had taken from his car.

At the doctor's office here, Padilla fell dead.

There was no foot wound, but a .22 caliber bullet was lodged near his heart.

State police said they were investigating.

Physicians at the University of Oregon Medical School in Portland said it would be uncommon but not impossible for a chest wound to be felt as a foot pain, either because of a sudden blood clot lodging in the brain, or the cutting of a nerve passage to the foot.

Padilla, a sugar beet field worker, leaves a wife and two small children at Tulare.

### Dalles Dam Bids Made

PORTLAND (AP) — A low bid of \$29,820,997 for construction work on the Dalles Dam was submitted Tuesday by a combination of nine Midwest contractors.

The bid for the third major work project on the Columbia River dam was well below the government estimate of \$36,677,520.

The dam, scheduled for completion in 1960, will be the nation's third largest power producer, generating 1,122,000 kilowatts. Only Grand Coulee and Hoover Dams exceed that output.

The cost will be about 350 million dollars. The government has spent about 19 million on the first two work projects.

The third project includes sub-structure and completion of an assembly bay at the powerhouse.

The proposals are revision of the state Constitution, and division of counties into districts for legislative representation.

After the study, the league will vote whether to support the proposals.

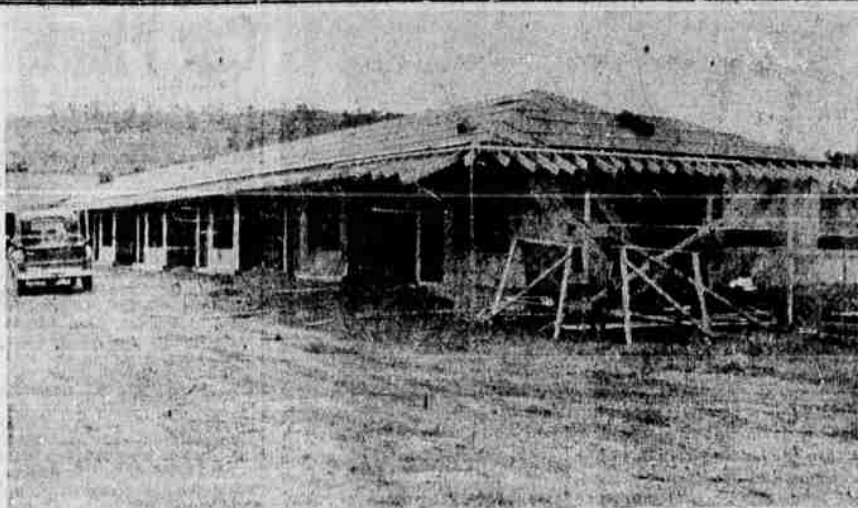
### Winnie-Georgi Talks Denied

LONDON (AP) — The Foreign Office denied Wednesday a report that Prime Minister Churchill is in informal touch with the Russians with the aim of arranging a Big Three conference.

But responsible British informants who gave out the story Tuesday said their information was accurate and added: "Events will prove the report correct."

A spokesman told reporters at the Foreign Office's daily news conference that Tuesday's report was untrue and "I am authorized to deny it."

The report said American leaders were being kept informed of the British-Russian contacts.

### State Line Club Burned

COEUR D'ALENE, Idaho (AP) — A spectacular fire destroyed the big State Line Gardens night club on the Washington - Idaho border early Wednesday with a loss estimated at more than \$500,000.

No one was injured but the frame 144 x 100-foot dine-dance-drink structure was reduced to rubble.

Preston Parsons, the owner, estimated the loss. He said the fire was first discovered about 3 a.m. When five people left in the restaurant smelled smoke. It was traced to the attic. The whole place was in flames within minutes.

Parsons said it probably was caused by a short in the wiring.

The club, 16 miles west of here halfway between Coeur D'Alene and Spokane, was the largest at the state line, an incorporated village made up of similar places.

The State Line Gardens had 50 slot machines. Parsons couldn't say how much cash was lost in the blaze.

### More Road Work Let By Commission

PORTLAND (AP) — The State Highway Commission acted on nearly four million dollars worth of contracts for highway construction projects at its monthly meeting which ended here Tuesday.

Of the total, \$1,296,000 worth of contracts were awarded; \$2,738,000 were accepted, subject to approval of the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads; \$909,200 were referred to the commission's engineer, and \$27,600 were rejected.

Largest project under consideration Tuesday was construction of about three miles of the new Portland-Salem expressway. Rogers Construction Co. of Portland submitted the low bid of \$478,685 for the project. The commission referred the bid to State Highway Engineer R. H. Baldock for further study.

The project would link Barbur Boulevard in Portland and the Willamette crossing of the Willamette River, where a bridge now is under construction, leaving about 20 miles still to build. Grading will start on it in the summer.

Other low bids referred to the engineer were for projects in Clackamas, Curry, Grant, Josephine and Multnomah Counties. All other contracts considered Tuesday were awarded to low bidders.

The commission refused to ban log hauling on the new water-level Columbia River Highway. Such hauling was forbidden on the old route and those in favor of banning timber cutting in the Columbia Gorge to preserve its scenic values, had asked that the same regulation apply on the new highway, but officials said the new highway is safe for log hauling.
