

McKay Urges Basin Funds

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of the Interior Douglas McKay today urged a Senate appropriations subcommittee to approve sufficient money for the orderly development of power projects in the Columbia River basin.

McKay said the area's power shortage will continue through 1953 or 1954 and will be worse if no new starts are authorized on hydroelectric projects.

It is important, he said, to push The Dalles dam to completion at the earliest possible moment to relieve the area's "terrible power shortage."

Funds for the The Dalles project have been scaled down to \$29,250,000 from the \$38,400,000 originally asked by ex-President Truman for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, and the House Appropriations Committee last week cut the project to \$29,250,000.

McKay said that the The Dalles project is an "important link in the power development system in the Northwest."

"It would be sad to restrict it now," he said.

Herbert G. West of Walla Walla, representing the Inland Waterways Association, said the maximum power development of the Columbia and Snake Rivers is necessary for the future progress of the Northwest.

The area already is experiencing a power shortage, he said, "but it will be even more severe unless new projects are started."

ROK Troops Fight Off Hot Attack

SEOUL (AP) — Sturdy South Korean infantrymen fought off a bitter three-hour attack early today by Chinese who stormed to the crest of an Allied outpost on the Eastern Front.

Standing off the raiders with hand grenades and close range rifle and machinegun fire, the ROKs reported killing or wounding some 60 Red raiders in the battle just southeast of Outpost Texas.

Other Allied troops cut down a dozen smaller Communist probes. U.N. raiding and reconnaissance patrols hit Red lines at 25 points across the 155-mile front.

An Eighth Army spokesman said the Red line is manned by 253,000 troops.

'Big J' Strikes Up Yellow Sea

Aboard the Battleship New Jersey off Chinnampo, Korea (AP) — The U. S. battleship New Jersey dealt Communist coastal defenses a surprise blow Monday after joining British naval forces off Korea's West Coast.

The "Big J" ventured far up the Yellow Sea to within striking range of Manchurian-based Communist MIGs and pounded Red shore batteries at the river approaches to the key port of Chinnampo, 75 miles from the battle front.

A clear sky and a smooth sea favored the New Jersey and escorting British ships for the bombardment that helped Allied forces usher in the 36th month of the Korean War.

New Jersey fired 84,000 pounds at gun positions in three large areas. Aerial spotters reported results "good to excellent."

These enemy shore batteries and others nearby have shelled two Allied-held islands not far offshore, threatening the outposts, which are important to Allied operations.

For the New Jersey, flagship of Vice Adm. J. J. (Jocko) Clark, U.S. Seventh Fleet commander, it was a surprise appearance off the West Coast, normally the bailiwick of British naval units. Only once before in the war — November, 1951, during her first tour — had the New Jersey appeared on this side of the peninsula.

AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands (AP) — A Convair liner of the Dutch KLM Line crashed in two pieces just outside Schiphol airport here Monday.

First reports said two bystanders—a woman and a child—had been killed and 20 of the plane's passengers injured.

The crash occurred as the ship was taking off on a regular flight for Paris. Apparently unable to get off the ground, the plane banged into trees and gates just outside the field and broke in two. There was no fire.

Fifth Air Force fighter-bombers ripped two supply and troop concentrations in Northwest Korea.

bombed scattered targets on Haeju Peninsula on the West Coast and hit Red frontline positions in morning stabs.

Striking in three waves, Marine fighter-bombers poured more than 22 tons of high explosives on a troop buildup at Sinmak, destroying 57 buildings, the Fifth Air Force reported.

Air Force Thunderjets demolished 18 buildings in a strike at a personnel and supply area and rail bridge south of Sukchon in West Central Korea.

Night lying B28 bombers also pounded Communist forward areas and slammed tons of bombs on North Korean roads, destroying 48 supply trucks, a locomotive and 18 boxcars.

American Sabre jets went MIG hunting deep in North Korea's MIG Alley, but found none to fight. Navy planes from the American carriers Boxer and Philippine Sea also were busy, bombing Red pos-

tions from Chongjin south to the frontlines.

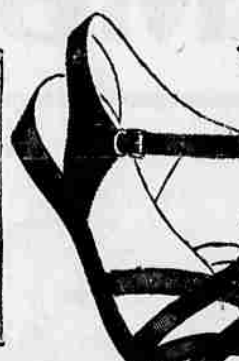

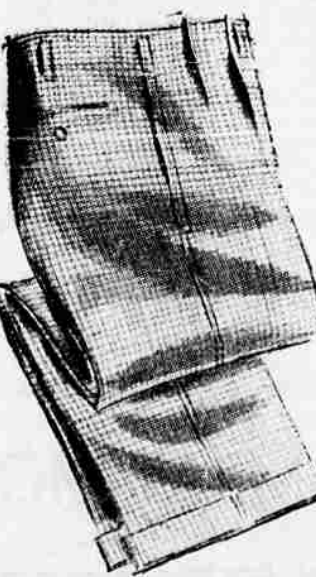

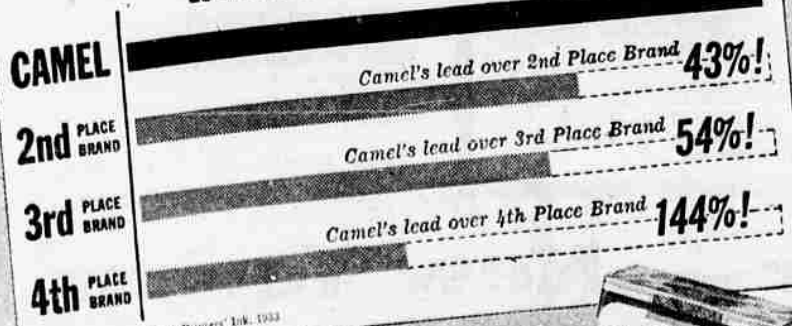
