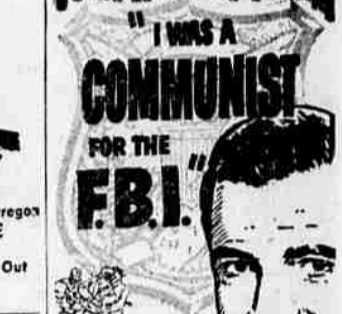
Mullin was serving a six-year sentence and Dorney, a three-year sentence on Multnomah County robbery convictions.
