Denmark Votes On Charter

COPENHAGEN, Denmark (U.P.)—The Danes vote today on a proposed new constitution which would allow a queen on their throne for the first time in five centuries.

By making women eligible to rule, the charter would permit King Frederick IX's 13-year-old oldest daughter, Princess Margrethe, eventually to succeed her father. Frederick has no sons.

Other clauses in the new constitution would abolish as obsolete the Upper House of Parliament, make the colony of Greenland an integral part of Denmark and permit the nation to surrender some sovereignty to international organizations.
