Helen Rambo reported on opportunities for girls in education and vocations.

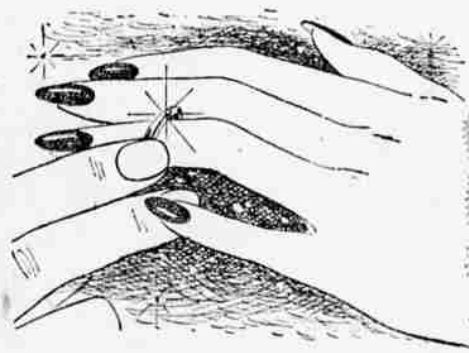
