HOLLYWOOD (AP)—The new 3-D techniques may be a boon to the box office, but they can be tough on actors.

So says Ann Miller, who is now tapping her way through "Kiss Me Kate," the first big musical to be done in wide screen and three dimensions. The actors are doing their work under huge banks of bright lights.

"The other day the temperature on the set was 120 degrees," reported long-stemmed Annie. "Then I had to step in and do a dance number in front of three mirrors. You can imagine how hot that was!"

The extra lights are needed for two reasons: the camera's range is wider and more of the set must be lighted; the set must be brighter because of the light lost by viewing the picture through tinted glasses.

Hearing of Top Defense Men on Cutbacks Set

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Pentagon's top command, including Secretary of Defense Wilson and the retiring chiefs of staff, gets a chance to speak up publicly this week in the dispute over military cutbacks.

All will appear before the Senate appropriations subcommittee conducting hearings on President Eisenhower's proposal to trim five billion dollars from former President Truman's new defense money request for the year starting July 1.

Many Democrats and some Republicans in Congress have voiced opposition to the reduction, but Rep. Mahon (D-Tex.), a veteran of such money battles, predicts Eisenhower will have his way.

Wilson, at whom most of the opponents' criticism has been heaped, has asked for a chance to explain in public the reasons behind the cutback decision. Some critics have called for Wilson's resignation and demanded to know what role the Joint Chiefs played in reaching the decision.

Leadoff witnesses today are Adm. William M. Fechteler, retiring Navy chief, and Secretary of the Navy Anderson.

Gen. J. Lawton Collins, outgoing Army chief, and Secretary of the Army Stevens are scheduled to testify tomorrow. Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg, stepping out as Air Force chief, and Secretary of the Air Force Talbott testify Wednesday in a session expected to provide the most fireworks.

Wilson and Under Secretary of Defense Roger M. Kyes are slated to appear Thursday.

Most of the congressional criticism has centered upon proposals to cut new funds for the Air Force by five billion dollars and reduce its mid-1955 goal from 143 to 120 combat wings of 3 to 75 airplanes each.

In data released Saturday, the Defense Department said that even with this reduction the Air Force would get the equivalent of another jet fighter wing in the next 1 1/2 years. But it said the program will trim out 1,150 noncombat planes.

New funds for the Navy were cut about a billion dollars, but Wilson said nearly 10 billions of new appropriations, plus unspent funds, would give the Navy a total

of more than 40 billions.

Of this, Wilson said about 11 billions would be spent in the fiscal year that begins July 1, adding this should provide about 408 warships and 16 carrier groups.

Wilson said the Army would continue to have 20 divisions, 18 regimental combat teams and 117 anti-aircraft battalions by expenditure of about 16 billion dollars in the next fiscal year.

The Eisenhower budget gave the Army about a billion more of new funds which, with unspent previous funds added, total above 30 billions.

In predicting approval of Eisenhower's defense program, Mahon indicated he personally opposes the proposed Air Force cutback. The Texas Democrat, who headed the House appropriations subcommittee on military spending under Democratic administrations, said he thought there might be a compromise "and the Air Force will get a little bit of a break."

Mahon appeared on a radio program for Texas stations yesterday, along with Senate Democratic Leader Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas. Johnson said the budget reductions "would cut some muscle as well as the fat in our defense."

However, the Defense Department maintained in its statement Saturday that too much money has been appropriated for the Air Force—more than can be spent in presently planned time.
