ILA to clean house. The council, which includes representatives from all 62 ILA locals in the port of New York, voted Tuesday night to:

1. Begin contract negotiations with employers two months ahead of schedule, with the idea of reaching agreement on abolition of the shape-up system of hiring.
 2. Instruct ILA locals to take immediate action toward adoption of a code of democratic union practices, approved by the parent body. The council, however, took no action on the AFL executive council's demand that the ILA oust union officials who have received bribes from employers or who have been convicted of crime.

Auto Output Exceeds Sales, But Deliveries Remain High

DETROIT (AP) — New car sales continue to maintain a high level although output so far this year has exceeded retail deliveries.

The production curtailment resulting from supplier plant strikes probably has cut into new car stocks to some extent, although the latest surveys showed vehicles in dealers' hands or en route from the factories at the highest levels in many months.

The question of retail prices is interesting more than a few of the industry analysts right now. Kaiser recently cut prices on his Henry J models. But so far as can be determined no car maker at present plans to follow Chrysler's action of a few weeks ago in reduc-

ing prices on all its models. What might happen to price schedules if sales drop off after mid-year with production continuing in high gear is something else. It is no secret that dealers have been offering high trade-in allowances in order to clinch new car sales. There isn't much likelihood the weeks immediately ahead will greatly improve this situation from the dealers' standpoint.

The dealers now are entering what should be the peak sales period of the year. But the manufacturing division also is striving to get back into the high production ground they occupied before the wave of supplier plant strikes started numerous car plant layoffs.

Industry experts, talking about price prospects, are convinced a reduction in the cost of numerous luxury accessories is a reasonable expectation. But they are reluctant to predict just when it may come.

There never has been a time in automobile industry history when so much luxury equipment has been offered and so widely bought. Very few, if any, new cars are now being assembled without some item of extra-cost equipment.

Morse, Boosting Higher Cop Pay, Digs GM Again

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon thinks that Washington firemen and policemen should be given larger pay increases than recommended by the Bureau of the Budget.

In a letter to Sen. Case (R-SD), Morse described the 8 per cent increase recommended by the bureau as shockingly low.

"Frankly, it seems to me that the Eisenhower administration ought to take greater interest in human values than it has in profits for General Motors," Morse said. Case is chairman of the District of Columbia Committee.

Morse was assigned to the District and Public Works Committees after failing to win reassignment to the Armed Services and Labor Committees.

Vice-Chancellor Of Education Picked

EUGENE (AP) — Dr. John B. Richards of New York University will become vice chancellor of the Oregon System of Higher Education July 15.

His appointment was announced Tuesday by Edgar W. Smith, president of the State Board of Higher Education.

Richards, 44, will fill the position which Charles D. Byrne vacated three years ago when he became chancellor. Like Byrne, Richards will serve as board secretary.

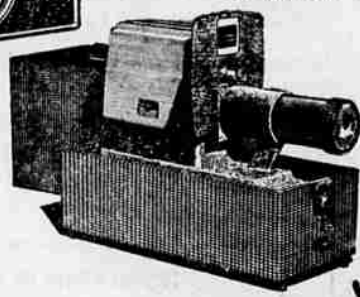
