Tent Caterpillars, Army Worms Harvesting Mightily

 Two of mankind's toughest insect foes—army worms and tent caterpillars—are voraciously rampaging in record hordes in several sections of the country this year. A check by Associated Press bureaus brought such comments as "heaviest infestation in 20 years," "worsening by the hour," "million dollar damage to crops," and comment by the U. S. Department of Agriculture that preliminary results of a survey now underway showed a "general outbreak" of army worms from the East Coast to the Mississippi.

At Watertown, N. Y., tent caterpillars blanketed railroad tracks in such hordes that a freight train was delayed 35 minutes as wheels skidded on the pulpy mass. Minne-

Beef Readied For Lion Meet

Over 1,000 pounds of prime beef is being prepared for the Lions Club convention barbecue which is to highlight opening day of the state convention in Klamath Falls June 14.

Three clubs—the Klamath Falls, Toketee and Merrill Lions — will play host to an expected group of 800 or more conventioners in a three-day meet, June 14, 15 and 16. Bob Drago, Clyde Hammond and Gib Fleet are to supervise preparation and serving of the barbecue which will include such incidentals as 1,000 potatoes of the large Klamath Gem variety, 10 gallons of cole slaw, pickles, olives and bun plus gallons of coffee and milk. Following the barbecue, an outstanding show is to be presented at Mills School auditorium featuring an entire cast imported from Los Angeles for a single performance. Monday will be devoted to business meetings, and to golfing and the colorful Governor's banquet and ball in the evening at the Armory. Tuesday will see concluding business sessions held.

A comprehensive program of meetings and entertainment has been prepared also for women Lions in addition to the barbecue, Sunday night show, and the Governor's banquet and ball.

Insurance \$6 Shy of Paying For May's Fires

Fire insurance companies just about bore the entire burden of fire losses in the city during May. Fire Chief Roy Rowe in his recap of last month's 15 city fires, reported losses totaling \$2,510 and insurance collected as \$2,504. Total value of property directly threatened by the blazes was \$1,746,968 and total insurance on the property was \$1,564,016. Defective wiring was the principal offender; five of the 15 fires were attributed to that cause, three were caused by hot metals including forgotten electrical appliances, two were caused by sparks, two by overheated or defective flues, one by friction and one by a careless smoker. Fire inspectors made 103 investigations and 19 hazards were corrected.

Biggest blaze the firemen battled last month was on May 20 at the St. Francis Apartments, 628 Oak. It was a mysterious fire which started in a bureau drawer of a tenant who was out of the city at the time. Some of the apartment furnishings and a large quantity of clothing and other personal effects were destroyed. That same day proved to be the most hectic one of the month. Shortly before 11:30 that night, the firemen had three alarms in three minutes from three different parts of the city. Fortunately, the alarms were caused only by high winds swaying electric lines, causing them to arc in a fiery but harmless display of sparks.

Atomic Energy Has Saved More Lives than It's Taken

NEW YORK (AP)—Atomic energy already has saved many times more lives than the 80,000 lost by atomic bombs exploded over Japan, Dr. John Z. Bowers said today.

Bowers, dean and professor of radiobiology, University of Utah College of Medicine, told the American Medical Association (AMA) that the life-saving has come through the use of radioactive atoms in medicines.

In a speech prepared for the closing session of the AMA convention, Bowers gave some examples of how atomic energy has quietly been saving lives: Radioactive atoms, which can be traced wherever they go, are in effect making the human body transparent. Doctors can learn where drugs go, how drugs do their good work, they can learn how glands work, even what part of living cells do the work which saves or preserves health.

Mysteries of the adrenal glands are being solved with the aid of radioactive atoms. This has aided in treatments of rheumatoid arthritis, and rheumatic fever, the great heart-killer among children. Radioactive iodine is helping in treating diseases, including cancer, of the thyroid gland, Bowers continued. And there are hopes that cancers elsewhere in the body can be treated by finding chemicals which will go just to those cancers. Those chemicals could be made radioactive, to go to the cancers and then give off atomic rays which would kill the cancer cells.

New research, Bowers said, promises better methods of protecting humans against radiation from A-bombs. It's ridiculous, apparently, to

warn everyone to quit doing vigorous exercise after 40, said Dr. Paul D. White, heart specialist from Boston, in another report. The quitting of exercise just because a person is 40 may even
