CLEVELAND (AP)—Take another look at that so-called fat man. His size may be due to anger. A New York psychiatrist, Dr. Elias Svitky, presented that explanation of obesity Thursday at the National Conference of Social Work here. He said modern psychiatrists have discovered fat people are not jolly at all, but "are actually taking out their hostility and unresolved aggressions by means of oral aggression"—eating too much and too often.

## No Verdict Reached In 'Communist' Suit

SPOKANE (AP)—A superior court jury was dismissed Friday after 44 hours of trying to reach a verdict in a \$55,000 slander suit filed by a union organizer who claimed a businessman called him a Communist. Nels T. Jydstrup, the jury foreman, told Judge Charles W. Greenough it appeared impossible for the jury to agree on a verdict. Alvin K. Schultz, an organizer for the AFL-Machinists union, claimed Don Williams, manager of an automobile firm, called him a Communist during a labor-management dispute. Williams denied it, said he only remarked that Schultz was "acting like a Communist."

## BIRTH RECORD SET

PORTLAND (AP)—Births reached an all-time high in Oregon last year, health officials announced Thursday. The total was 39,376, more than 2,000 above the previous record years of 1947 and 1951.

## WCTU Would Ban Driving, Flying For Day After Drink

VANCOUVER, B. C. (AP)—The world convention of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union proposed laws Friday against driving a car or piloting an airplane within 24 hours after an alcoholic drink. The resolution keynoted the world organization's vow for all-out war against drunken driving.

## Here We Go Again On Rosenberg Pleas

NEW YORK (AP)—The U.S. Court of Appeals Friday denied a stay of execution to condemned atom spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, scheduled to die in Sing Sing Prison's electric chair June 18. Judge Thomas E. Swan told Emanuel Bloch, counsel for the Rosenbergs, that he might apply for a stay before the Supreme Court already has refused three times to review the case. Bloch said several days ago if all else failed he would appeal to President Eisenhower for clemency. Eisenhower previously has refused such a request.

## Fortune Teller Right For Once

JERSEY CITY, N.J. (AP)—Mrs. Lucille Wallace drew this forecast of her future Thursday from the fortune teller: "Everything you try to do you will succeed at." Mrs. Wallace, a policewoman, replied quickly: "That's all I want to know, I want to place you under arrest." Mrs. Anna Mitchell, 57, was accused by Mrs. Wallace of accepting a marked \$5 bill for "pretending to have skilled and crafty science to predict the future." She was charged with being a disorderly person.

## Ex-Dancer Faces Kidnaping Charge

NEW YORK (AP)—The state Friday indicted Mrs. Barney Lee Grimm, 24, former carnival dancer accused of kidnaping two children in Washington and bringing them to New York. An indictment handed up by a grand jury contained four counts of kidnaping and four of endangering the health of a child. Mrs. Grimm has said she took the children, Clifton Bradford, two, and his sister, Diane, one, from their home on May 15 because she "felt sorry" for them. She said they lived in an atmosphere of quarrelling and drinking. Both children were returned safely to welfare authorities in the nation's capital.
