### Sunday Accidents Kill 3 in State

Three persons died in traffic accidents in Oregon Sunday. Jerry Jackson Henaley, 40, and his wife, Dora, 45, were drowned when their pickup truck ran off an embankment 15 miles west of Vale and overturned in Bully Creek.

A neighbor discovered the mishap when he saw the tail light of the truck still shining under water. Kirby J. Haden, 18, Gilchrist, was injured fatally when a car in which he was riding collided with another car 95 miles north of Klamath Falls on Highway 97. The driver, Kenneth Freeman, and four other passengers, were injured. The driver of the other car, John Tooney, about 50, of Gilchrist, was not hurt.

### Guards Ready For Ft. Lewis

PORTLAND (AP) — Some 4,000 members of the Oregon-Washington National Guard are preparing for their annual summer encampment at Fort Lewis, Wash.

Troops from the 41st Infantry Division begin the two-week training period June 13 and finish June 27. It will be the Sunset Division's sixth summer training camp since World War II, and the fifth at Fort Lewis.

About 3,500 Oregon guardsmen will join some 2,500 from Washington for the summer camp. Maj. Gen. Harold G. Mason, Salem, superintendent of the Oregon State Police, will direct the training as division commander.

The guardsmen will move into a special tent city in the northeast fort area, part of the huge military reservation. A highlight of the two weeks will be a division exercise in which all units will take to the field for several nights.

The 41st holds an open house June 20 at the annual Governors' Day review, when visitors from home watch the guardman parade at Gray Field.

## 'Party Line,' Some 200 New State Laws Become Effective This Week

OLYMPIA (AP) — More than 200 new laws passed by the 1953 Legislature go into effect next Thursday.

One of them creates a five-man State Power Commission with broad powers to buy, build and operate dams, power plants and electric transmission lines.

Another outlaws the few bottle clubs still operating. The public's right to know about public business is assured in one of the laws which require state and local government agencies to conduct public meetings.

Other new laws will boost the pay of Supreme and Superior Court judges county officials and court reporters.

One of the 1953 enactments makes it illegal to refuse to give up the use of a party line to another person who wants to make an emergency call.

Still others authorize construction, if feasible, of a new toll bridge across the Columbia River between Vancouver and Portland; a toll express highway between Tacoma and Everett by way of Seattle, and a second floating bridge across Lake Washington. A law already in effect authorizes construction of bridges across Puget Sound if a study shows they are feasible.

Many of the other new laws going into effect Thursday make changes of one kind or another in existing statutes.

A total of 222 new laws go into effect at 12:01 a.m. June 11. They are part of the 297 statutes enacted by the regular and special sessions. Most of the remaining 75 already are in effect.

It was at about the time the concussion wave would have reached here from Yucca Flat, some 600 airline miles away.

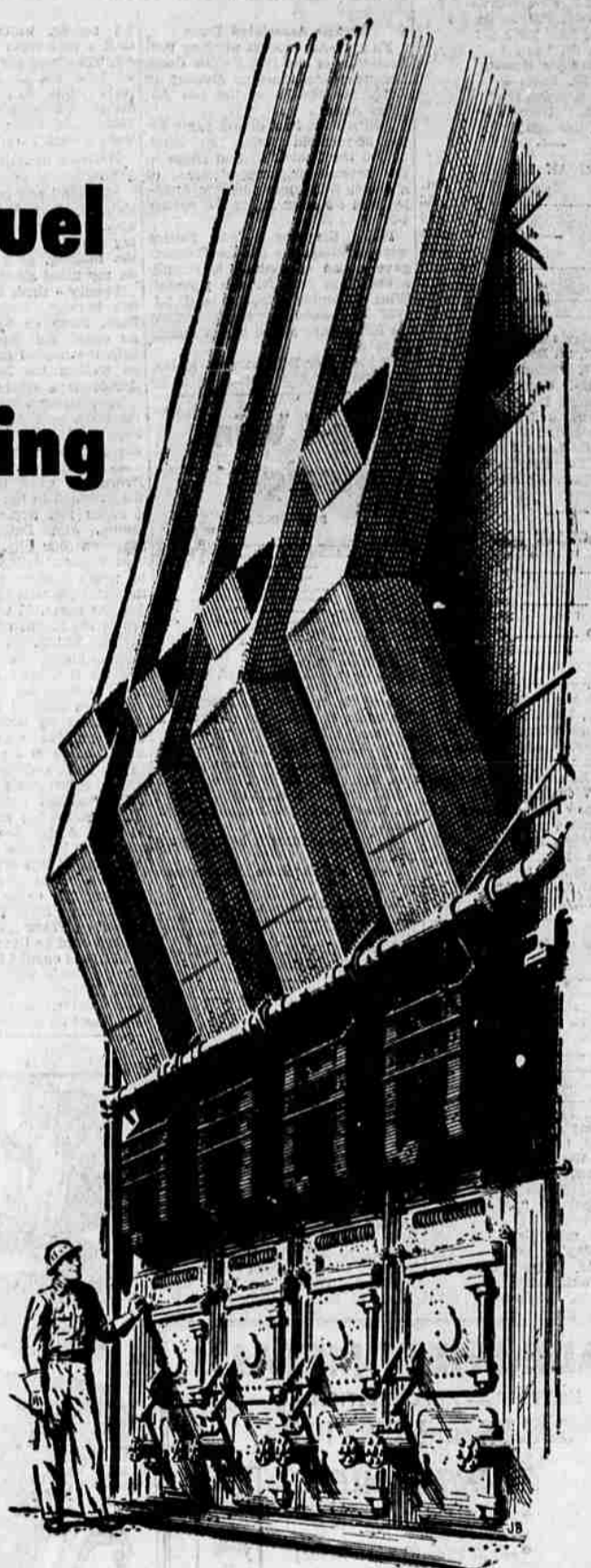
