## Swiss Hoped To Reverse POW Refusal

 WASHINGTON (AP)—U. S. officials expressed hope today that Switzerland would reconsider its refusal to participate in a five-nation prisoner of war commission in Korea unless South Korea agrees to the prospective treaty.

Swiss Minister Charles Bruggmann delivered a note to the State Department last night giving notice of his government's attitude a few hours after the decision was made at Bern.

The Swiss Federal Council (cabinet) said in a statement that Switzerland could not serve on the commission unless the mandate to do so "were received from all parties to the Korean conflict, including South Korea, and unless Switzerland were permitted to exercise its full independence and in the common interest of both sides in the conflict."
