Polio Cases Lead 1952's

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Public Health Service reported Thursday that infantile paralysis cases this year are running about 30 per cent ahead of the corresponding period in 1952, a record year with 57,636 cases.

Last week 47 states listed 248 new cases, more than double the 119 in the similar week of 1952.

"This ran the 1953 total to 2,817 cases, with no report last week from Wisconsin, compared with 2,166 in the similar 1952 period. And, for the "disease year," which began about April 1, this year's total has reached 1,235 cases compared with 946 a year ago.

The number of cases of poliomyelitis increased in several states, especially in the South Atlantic and South Central States," the health service said in a weekly summary.

Farm-Labor Link-up Urged

MEDFORD (AP)—A farm-labor combination to bring about a ballot box purge of some legislators was urged here Wednesday by James T. Marr, secretary of the State Federation of Labor.

He won applause from delegates at the annual state Grange convention with a proposal that officials from the Grange, the Oregon Farmers Union, the AFL, CIO and railroad brotherhoods meet next month to "agree on a purge list of 10 or 12 legislators who voted against you and against us, and work for their elimination."

Marr called the 1953 Legislature the "most reactionary session in many years."

Marr also predicted that the State Federation of Labor, when it meets next week at Coos Bay, will join the Grange in protesting against the administration's recent decision not to oppose the Idaho Power Company's proposal to build three low dams on the Snake River above Hells Canyon.

The delegates heard Albert Ullman, president of the Hells Canyon Development Association, criticize Secretary of Interior McKay for the Hells Canyon decision.

The Grange voted to hold next year's meeting at Albany.

Rose Festival Queen Chosen

PORTLAND (AP)—The Portland Rose Festival Thursday named its annual climax after selecting a queen before 18,000 persons in Multnomah Stadium Wednesday night.

The climax comes Friday with the floral parade, an event that police estimate has drawn crowds of 300,000 or more each year recently.

The queen selected was a 16-year-old blonde, Nancie Williams, a Lincoln High School student. She was one of eight high school nominees.

Stadium shows will be held Thursday and Friday nights, featuring ski jumps on a high man-made slide, built of steel scaffolding and topped with artificial snow.

Street-Fighter Dies From Minor Hurts

PORTLAND (AP)—Fred Kelenkon, 50, Portland, died in a hospital here Wednesday, three days after a street fight in which he suffered injuries that were at first believed to be minor.

Police arrested Angelo Bigoni as the man he fought.

The dead man's brother, John, told police the fight began after the brothers took a picture inside a night club, and a picture objected.
