**Perez Tile Plant Burns**

**John W. Herron Services Held**

**PORTLAND**—Funeral services were held here June 5 for John Ward Herron, 36, manager of the John Day branch store of Moty and Van Dyke, Inc., and a former resident of Klamath Falls. He had been ill since April 25, and died June 2, 11 a.m., in a Portland Hospital.

Final rites, under auspices of Lents Lodge No. 156, A.F.A.M., Portland, were conducted at 10 o'clock in the morning in the drawing room chapel of Colonial Mortuary at Sandy Boulevard and 14th Avenue. Dr. Roy A. Fedie, Rose City Methodist Church, Portland, officiated. H. Lynn Gordon, Portland, vocalist, sang "Abide With Me" with Kathleen Stewart, Portland, organist.

Military rites were held for the deceased, a veteran of World War II, at Willamette National Cemetery, Portland, where vault interment was made.

John Ward Herron, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Herron, was born Dec. 14, 1916, at Leoti, Kans. He was graduated from Medford High School in 1936. During World War II, he served three years in the United States Navy and spent a considerable part of that time in South Pacific fighting areas.

An employee of Moty and Van Dyke, Inc., the past 20 years, he had served as manager of the John Day store since November, 1947. Prior to being transferred to John Day, he worked in the company headquarters store at Klamath Falls and managed the store in Lakeview.

He was a member of John Day Lodge No. 1824, B.P.O.E., Master Mason in Klamath Falls Lodge No. 77, A.F.A.M., and member of Baker Consistory, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, Valley of Baker, and Al Kader Temple of the Mystic Shrine, Portland.

His survivors are: two daughters, Cynthia Ann and Vernetta, Shelton, Wash.; three sisters, Mrs. K. N. Anthony, Shelton; Mrs. A. D. Corlies, Gresham and Mrs. W. E. Sterling, Altadena, Calif.; and four brothers, William P. Herron, Klamath Falls, James E. and Wayne E. Herron, Scott City, Kans., and Victor R. Herron, Ravia, Okla. His parents and a brother, Floyd, preceded him in death.
