

First Money Bill Passed

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate Thursday passed and sent to the White House a \$3,444,145,000 bill to run the Treasury and Postoffice Departments in the year starting July 1.

This is the first of the 12 big money bills to be sent to the President by Congress.

The Senate did not make a single change in the House version of Treasury-Postoffice Department bill—an extremely rare performance.

The Senate passed the bill by voice vote after defeating 44 to 31, an effort by Sen. Douglas (D-Ill.) to cut the funds for postal operations by \$33,450,000.

The total in the bill was \$5,425,000 under the allotments to the two departments in the current fiscal year. It was \$127,983,000 under what former President Truman asked.

After Roberts took office he introduced a resolution for the extra holiday for the Isenhour youngsters and the bill passed.

So it's Christmas today for Billy and Jack—Christmas free, presents, and all-topped off by a swimming party and picnic.
