NBC and CBS were in open competition as to which would be the first to telecast the coronation ceremonies—and had chartered planes to stand by in London to rush the films to the U.S. It appears that NBC beat CBS—but ironically CBC (Canadian Broadcasting Corporation) were first of the three.
