### Man Sues For Loss Of 'Wonder Dog Of Europe'

LOS ANGELES (AP) — An Irishman would sue \$600,000 damages for the death of his trained dog in a railroad baggage car.

Bernard Mitchell, a citizen of Ireland who is now living in Orange County, filed suit in Federal Court yesterday against the Union Pacific and Chicago North-western Railroads. His complaint says the trained fox terrier, Pud-sy, described as "The Wonder Dog

of Europe," died en route to California last June. Mitchell's suit asserted that he was promised when he left Chicago on the same train with the dog that he would have access to the baggage car to feed and water Pudsy. But after leaving Chicago, Mitchell alleged, he was informed that the baggage car was sealed. He added that the dog was dead when the train arrived in California.



### Report India Still Ready

NEW DELHI (AP) — An authoritative Indian source said Friday the New Delhi government is still prepared to carry out its undertaking to participate in a Korean truce commission, despite South Korea's release of anti-Communist North Korean prisoners.

### US Seizes Second Foreign-Owned Ship

LONG BEACH (AP) — The federal government has seized a second ship here this week in its drive against non-American ownership of war surplus vessels.

There has been no official reaction from Sweden, Czechoslovakia and Poland—the other members named to the commission.

The 18,500-ton tankship Destiny was seized yesterday on charge that its registration violates federal shipping laws. The seizure took place after the tanker discharged 113,000 barrels of crude oil, brought from Fao, Iraq, and consigned to the Richfield Oil Corp.

### 17-Year-Old Lou Costello Sketch To Be Acted Again

By JAMES BACON HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Seventeen years ago a burlesque comic by the name of Lou Costello wrote a comedy sketch about a baseball team. He and his partner tried it out on the stage of Minsky's Republic Theater on New York's 42nd Street.

They got the \$20 fee for performing the sketch at a Philadelphia amusement park.

The show director threw the sketch out after the first matinee performance. A few years later, Costello teamed up with Bud Abbott and graduated from burlesque to big-time radio on the Kate Smith show. The two tried to revive the baseball sketch about a baseball team. He and his partner tried it out on the stage of Minsky's Republic Theater on New York's 42nd Street.

"We paid our agent \$2 and used up the other \$18 on rides on the miniature train," recalled Lou. The \$15,000 fee came for a special anniversary broadcast of an Eastern drug chain.
