Teamsters Hit Airline Denial

SEATTLE (AP) - The Civil Aeronautics Board's refusal to grant United Airlines a license for non-stop flights from Seattle-Tacoma and Portland to Chicago drew an angry editorial blast from the official publication of the AFL Teamsters Union in the Pacific Northwest Friday.

The Washington Teamster, in an article by CAB Member Joe Adams for particular criticism, called for a presidential inquiry into the matter.

The editorial asked whether Adams, former head of the State Department of Aeronautics, represents the interests of the public or the interests of Northwest Airlines.

The publication noted that Adams' appointment to the CAB was sponsored by Sen. Warren Magnuson (D-Wash.), who is a stockholder in NWA which now provides the only non-stop service between the Northwest and Chicago.

The union publication said Northwest Airlines had shown it was incapable of providing dependable service to meet the needs of Seattle.

The CAB, in denying United's application, said such competition would weaken NWA's already weak financial situation.

Unwed Mother, 10, Likes Her Dollies Best

YOUNGSTOWN, O. (AP) - A 10-year-old mother played with two dolls today in a home for unwed mothers while welfare authorities prepared to offer her six-day-old daughter for adoption.

The girl showed little interest in the baby and preferred the dolls she brought with her when she entered the Florence Crittenton Home last February, said Mrs. Esther Stuhlfiere, home superintendent.

Mrs. Stuhlfiere said the baby weighed just an ounce under six pounds. The fifth-grade mother, whose name was withheld, was so tense and frightened she was in labor 56 hours.

Father of the baby was a 50-year-old man who lived in the same apartment building and was a close friend of the little mother's foster parents, Mrs. Stuhlfiere said.

The girl-mother's birth date is recorded as Feb. 12, 1943. She is five feet, three inches tall, and weighs 115 pounds. The American Medical Association in Chicago said it knew of at least two American girls of 10 who had children through full-term births.

Conviction Cost Of Rosenbergs About \$150,000

WASHINGTON (AP) - The government has not yet tallied the full cost of convicting Julius and Ethel Rosenberg as atom spies and sending them to the electric chair.

Justice Department officials Saturday offered a "very rough estimate" that the bill will run somewhere around \$150,000.

This would cover the salaries of department attorneys especially assigned to the case, the printing of briefs and similar expenses, but not the operating costs of the many courts which have dealt with the case and other "intangibles."

A major item of the government's expense is the approximately \$2,400 which the U.S. will pay to the State of New York for keeping the couple at Sing Sing for more than two years. The agreed rate was \$40 per day. Mrs. Rosenberg was the only woman in the death house, and authorities assigned female guards and made other special provisions.

The U.S. will also pay New York for a special fee for carrying out the execution, but officials said they have not been advised what this will amount to.

Norman Ross, Disc-Jockey, Dies at 57

CHICAGO (AP) - Norman Ross, 57, radio and television disc jockey for the National Broadcasting Company, and one time holder of 72 world swimming records, died last night in a suburban Evanston hospital.

A former newspaperman, Ross once worked for the Portland Oregonian, the San Francisco Examiner and the old Chicago Journal. He joined NBC in 1933.

State Cops Kill Berrypicker

HOOD RIVER (AP) - Two state patrolmen shot and killed a berry picker who had blazed away at them in a two-gun frenzy Friday. Both patrolmen were wounded.

The dead man was Elmer R. Jennings, 62, of Portland. He was shot to death in the doorway of his cabin on the Claude Allegre farm south of here.

State Police Sgt. Charles U'Ren said Allegre had asked for someone to talk with Jennings because the old man went about armed and spoke of being ready when the Communists came to get him.

So Patrolmen Anton Krivak of Hood River and Bernard Ross of The Dalles went to the farm.

Jennings greeted them at the cabin door with a gun in each hand. He shot first at Ross then at Krivak. Both men returned the fire and Jennings was felled with six bullets in his body.

Neither of the policemen was badly wounded, hospital attendants said.
