

Senate Committee Okays Half-Billion Flood Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Appropriations Committee Tuesday approved a bill carrying \$495,490,100 for flood control and navigation projects in the year starting July 1.

The total is 12.3 per cent over the House-approved bill but 5.2 per cent under President Eisenhower's budget recommendation.

Money for the waterways projects is contained in the Army civil function appropriation bill which also carries funds for operation for the Panama Canal and national cemeteries.

As approved by the Senate committee the bill carries an overall total of \$474,112,000 compared with \$416,291,600 in the House bill and President Eisenhower's recommendations of \$479,490,100.

Included in the Senate committee bill is a total of \$13,315,400 for the Panama Canal.

As passed by the House the bill carried \$392,284,100 for waterways projects which was nearly 17 per cent under the Eisenhower budget

recommendation and nearly 40 per cent under those of former President Truman who asked \$661,524,100.

The Senate committee thus hiked the House allowances for flood control and navigation projects by \$58,206,000.

Flood control and navigation projects include (first figure is amount approved by the subcommittee, followed in parentheses by the amount allowed earlier this year by the House):

IDAHO — Albeni Falls reservoir \$4,840,000 (\$4,000,000); Lucky Peak reservoir \$1,205,000 (\$1,400,000).

OREGON — Lookout Point reservoir \$18,000,000 (\$18,000,000); McNary lock and dam \$27,700,000 (\$25,000,000); The Dalles Dam \$34,000,000 (\$29,250,000); Willamette River Bank protection \$310,000 (\$330,000); Amazon Creek \$245,000 (nothing).

WASHINGTON — Chief Joseph Dam \$3,750,000 (\$3,000,000); Lower Columbia fish sanctuary program \$5,750,000 (\$1,250,000).

One-Man Railroad Covers One-Mile Gap By Going Two

MILLINGTON, Ill. (AP) — From Millington to Newark is a mile as the crow flies but the Illinois Midland is no crow.

The Illinois Midland is a two-mile-long railroad with one locomotive run by engineer Bill Thorsen of Newark. Thorsen also is

conductor, brakeman, yardman, freight clerk and repair crew.

It takes two miles to cover one because the right of way is laid through the lowlands between the two Kendall County villages. That's why Thorsen frequently spends more time as repair crew than as engineer. The tracks run through quicksand and often spread, derailing the engine or cars.

Coming to Millington from Newark isn't too bad a trip. It's the return run that's tough. Its uphill and Thorsen has to keep a sharp eye for possible derailments. Musk-rats have been known to undermine the tracks in the marshy lowlands. In the spring they frequently are flooded.

And there always are cattle straying from pastures to the tracks and making Thorsen waste a lot of steam on his whistle.

Engineer Thorsen already has gone through one locomotive. That was 20 years ago. The Newark Farmers Elevator Company, owner of the line, looked around and found a replacement, a little relic from a short line in Lee County that went out of business.

The little railroad is used to haul loaded grain cars from Newark to the Burlington connection in Millington. On return runs Thorsen hauls coal, oil, fertilizer and other products for the farmers company.

Schuman Group Terms Extended

STRASBURG, France (AP) — France's Jean Monnet and his eight colleagues in the High Executive which runs the six-nation Schuman Coal-Steel Pool have had their jobs extended for a second year.

The Schuman group's Assembly gave them a virtually unanimous vote of confidence last night. Four West German Socialist members abstained.

50 Oregon Cons Slick From Pork

SALEM, Ore. (AP) — Warden Clarence T. Gladden reported today about 50 convicts at the state penitentiary here have become ill with food poisoning. All are expected to recover.

Samples of pork served last week were sent to the State Hygienic Laboratory in Portland for testing. Dr. Willard Stone, Marion County health officer, said the pork had not been cooked sufficiently.

McKay Names Baker Man To Field Post

WASHINGTON (AP) — George L. Scott of Baker, Ore., was named by Interior Secretary McKay Tuesday as a field representative for the Interior Department.

Scott and McKay have been friends for years, both being former automobile dealers — McKay at Salem and Scott at Baker. Scott also was coach at Baker High School from 1929 to 1933 and assistant coach at Oregon State College from 1933 to 1938.

Jess Gard, Oregon Republican national committeeman, said he understood that Scott would be assigned to "some kind of special work" on McKay's staff.

Scott said he planned to leave for Washington about July 1. He will take his family with him, he said.
