Prisoners Convicted For Kidnapping Man

SALEM (AP)—Four state prison convicts will be sentenced Friday for kidnapping Edmund A. Meola, state highway landscape architect, when they escaped April 13.

They were convicted Tuesday by a Circuit Court jury. The maximum sentence for the crime is 25 years.

The men are Marcellus Winters, Ray Barber, Charles Smith and William Smith.
