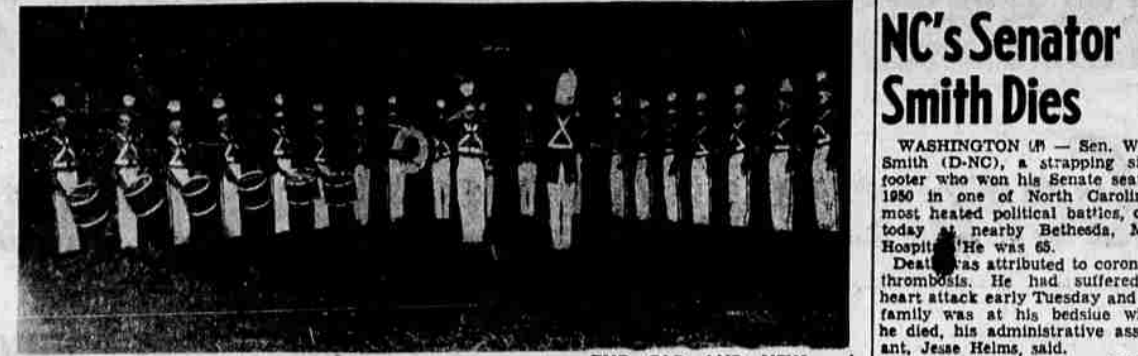

Falls Drum & Buglers Amaze Selves By Capturing Trophy

 Klamath Legionnaires last week took the first long step toward getting back in an old familiar rut—The winning of the Legion's state championship for drum and bugle corps.
 Back in 1939, after the Klamath Corps had walked off with the championship five out of six years, winning permanent possession of the championship cup the Klamath athletes turned the cup over to Salem's Post 9 to be entered in competition again. And the Klamath Corps disbanded, apparently to give other state posts a chance at the cup.
 Early last spring, as Legionnaires began planning for the state convention held here last summer, they decided to form another corps to take part in the convention. It was such a long shot that no one even mentioned the possibility of recapturing the state championship with the new corps.
 Hillsboro's fine corps was the defending champion and appeared headed for more championships. Hillsboro did win here again last year and immediately began prep for the big third win this year which would give them permanent possession of the cup.
 But the Klamath Falls outfit declared Hillsboro should at least be challenged and almost nightly rehearsals began here. At the state convention last week almost anyone except the Klamath corpsmen would have bet you the family jewels against a handful of stale popcorn that Hillsboro would wait to the third championship.
 But the Klamath Legionnaires blithely ignored the form chart and snappily took the championship away from Hillsboro.
 The new corps was organized here under leadership of Jack Benner, Warner Fett (musical director), Mike Elitreit (drill instructor) and Post Commander Dick Gallagher (drum major).

World's Largest Painting Spread Out On Graded Lot

BALTIMORE (AP)—The world's largest painting—labored over by 128 artists for four years—was unrolled yesterday for the first time since 1933 and found to be in pretty good shape.
 The 18,900-square-foot canvas was unveiled on an East Baltimore lot for William Haussner, the restaurant man and art collector who bought it at auction last summer for \$3,400.
 Yesterday was the first time he had seen the painting, called Pantheon de la Guerre and created in tribute to the Allied victory in World War I.
 There was a relatively small hole in it, but the colors, costumes and faces of the 6,000 life-size figures in the panorama were in excellent condition.
 The painting was last displayed at the Chicago World's Fair and, after a bit of travel about the country, was stored and forgotten until the auction.
 Haussner's first view of it came with the help of two 20-ton cranes, three trucks and 22 men who graded the lot so the Pantheon could be spread outdoors on nearly level ground.
 He said he plans to give it to a war veterans organization.
