## Cotton Report 'Inaccurate'

**SPOKANE (AP)**—The report of John S. Cotton, California consulting engineer, which favors a high federal dam at Hells Canyon on the Snake River instead of three small privately built units, is inaccurate, Governor Langlie told Spokane Rotarians Thursday.

The governor challenged Cotton's estimate that the three dams and transmission lines would cost \$25 million dollars. He said the true figure should be 153 millions. He also said the three dams would produce 96 per cent of the firm power that could be generated at Hells Canyon and cost only one-third as much.

The governor told the club members that steam power could be produced for less money to get the results hoped for at Hells Canyon.

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## Nationalist Troop Move Agreed Upon

**BANGKOK (AP)**—A four-nation commission Thursday agreed on plans for removing 12,000 Nationalist Chinese troops from North Burma to Formosa through Siam.

The evacuation could begin early in July after the four governments—Burma, Nationalist China, Thai-

land and the U.S.—approve the plan.

The Nationalist troops fled into Burma before the Communists and have operated there as guerrillas under command of Gen. Li Mi.

Although the Nationalist government on Formosa disclaimed responsibility for the troops, the Burmese government appealed to the U.N. for their removal in fear of a possible Red attack.

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## Atomic Energy 'Hot Potato,' Hence Kept From Industry

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—Rep. Hollifield (D-Calif.) said Thursday the administration has sidetracked proposals for immediate efforts to get private industry into atomic production because the question

has become a "hot potato."

Hollifield is a member of the Senate-Atomic Energy Committee, which is holding hearings on a plan by Chairman Gordon Dean of the Atomic Energy Commission to private interests to operate atomic facilities and deal in fissionable materials. The law now restricts these fields to the government.

## Library Group Hits State Dept.

**LOS ANGELES (AP)**—The American Library Association has criticized what it calls the "confused and fearful response" by the State Department to attacks on U. S. overseas libraries.

The criticism was contained in a resolution adopted yesterday by association's annual conference.

Of the State Department and its policies on overseas libraries, the resolution said:

"The hastily changed directives, the delays in the purchase of books, the charges of book burning, the fear to buy any books at all have presented a shocking picture abroad and have seriously damaged the effectiveness of the program."

"We reaffirm our conviction of the indispensable value of free libraries."

The ALA council said it opposed the removal of books from the overseas libraries. This announcement followed the report of a State Department official in Washington that more than 300 titles have been taken from these libraries on grounds that the books are pro-Communist.

But Rep. Cole (R-N.Y.), chairman of the congressional budget, released a letter from Budget Director Joseph M. Dodge saying that "additional time" will be necessary before the administration can prepare its recommendations for changes in the law. No action is expected until next year.

Hollifield said in an interview the Dodge letter "indicates the administration will not support" Dean's proposals at this time. "They realize now they've got a hot potato," he said.

Dean resigns Monday as AEO chairman. Lewis L. Strauss, named to succeed him, told newsmen he would not comment on the issue until his appointment is confirmed. He said he had been kept informed of the AEO plans as the President's atomic adviser during the last three months.

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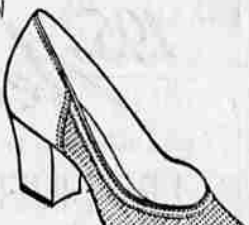
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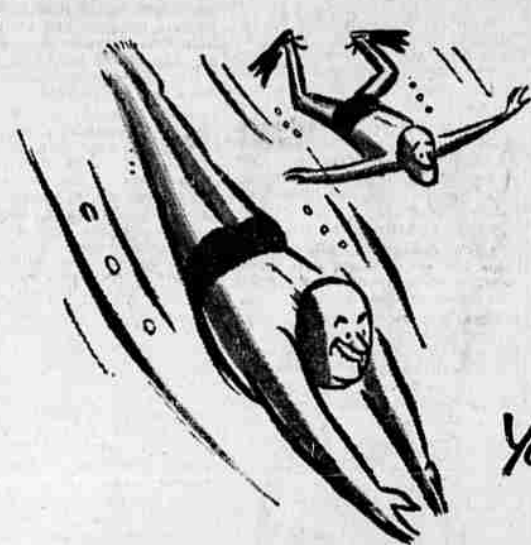


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
