Children Should Contact Psychiatrists More Often

Unanimous agreement of mental health experts interested in services for children, point to the need for more frequent contacts of psychiatrists, than are now available.

Plans for increasing local services were advanced here Wednesday at a luncheon meet at the Winema hotel of interested persons, a newly created committee interested in mental health. Dr. John W. Waterman, director of

the Mental Hygiene Division of the State Board of Health and Dorothy Hurley of the Jackson County Health Department.

Psychiatric services for children of Klamath County have been available in the past through the Oregon Psychiatric Service operated jointly by the University of Oregon Medical School and the State Board of Health through traveling clinics. These clinics usually spent one or two days a year here.

It is hoped to have a full-time worker in the field by the time school opens next fall with a visiting psychiatrist twice a month for conferences.

Dr. Waterman explained benefits of a more consistent program and discussed methods of continuing and strengthening this valuable service.

The meeting was presided over by the Rev. D. L. Proett, recently appointed chairman of the Mental Health Committee.

A second meeting is planned for July 7 at the Klamath County Health Unit, 1249 Main.

Marketing Of Salvable O & C Timber Speeded By McKay

WASHINGTON (U) — An attempt to speed up the salvage of millions of dollars worth of timber in Western Oregon O & C lands led to some marketing changes Wednesday.

Secretary of Interior McKay said that henceforth:

Lakeview Teacher Off To Pakistan

LAKEVIEW — William H. Holloway left June 19 for Washington, D.C., on his way to Karachi, Pakistan, for his new assignment in the U.S. technical assistance program. He has a two-year leave of absence from Lakeview High School where he has been Smith-Hughes agriculture instructor since 1938.

Holloway will be joined in Pakistan by Mrs. Holloway and their three daughters later this year. During his absence, his place at LHS will be filled by Delmer Dooley who arrived here June 13 from Platte, South Dakota.

Holloway went first to Los Angeles to visit relatives and arrived in Washington, D.C. on Sunday of this week to begin a five weeks orientation course at the Foreign Service Institute. He will then fly to Karachi pending permanent assignment. His work will be to train teachers for instruction in modern farming methods and he will assist in setting up the agriculture training program in Pakistan.

1. The Bureau of Land Management, which handles the timber sales could sell up to 500,000 board feet of timber without advertising, provided that the sale be to a logging firm that already has a contract in the area.

2. District forests in the O & C area may act on contracts and other matters in connection with timber sales of less than a million board feet of timber.

3. Up to 250,000 board feet of salvagable timber can be sold without guaranteeing the use of access roads to the timber.

McKay said he acted on recommendations from Edward Woolley, Bureau of Land Management administrator, and the O & C Advisory Board.

Previously sales in excess of 100,000 board feet had to be advertised. McKay said this caused needless delays in the program and deterioration of timber.

Woolley estimated there were more than three billion board feet of timber on O & C lands that has been killed by fire, toppled by wind or damaged by beetles. He

said about a billion feet could be salvaged readily, and estimated it could be sold for about 20 million dollars.

"An emergency situation exists and will inevitably continue to exist for a minimum of three more years," Woolley said, explaining that the downed timber formed a breeding place for beetles.

A salvage program was started in 1951 after a series of fires and

windstorms. Woolley estimated that now is 29 per cent completed. He said 287,418,000 board feet of

timber was salvaged in the past 1 1/2 years, bringing in \$5,344,000.
